Disaster Context

Albania is vulnerable to a range of disasters, and like several countries in the region, the greatest single disaster threat is that of severe earthquake. In addition, records indicate there is a typical risk across Albania of small-scale disasters related to floods, landslides, forest fires, and snowstorms.

Nearly 30 percent of Albanians live below the poverty line of 2 US\$ per capita a day. Poor infrastructure and public services, an insufficiently regulated building boom, poor watershed management and a range of other environmental factors compound the vulnerability of the population to disasters. The political situation in Albania has stabilized since the almost total collapse of public order in 1997, but frequent changes in government still strain institutional memory and the ability of the country to deal with disasters.

Programme Activities

Between January 2002 and January 2005, the project aims to accomplish:

- A multi-hazard risk assessment
- Capacity-building for the collection and analysis of data on risks and vulnerability in government and academia
- Establishment of an operations room at the central government level and a database for planning and coordination (Geographic Information System)
- Initiation and facilitation of an inclusive, multi-sectoral disaster planning process
- Design of a relevant training curriculum for government and civil society disaster managers
- Training of trainers and focal points in prefectures, communes, and municipalities
- Operation reviews and simulations
- Hardware support to central and local government
- Partnership between the Ministry of Local Government, Albanian Red Cross and UNDP to strengthen disaster preparedness at the local level
- Public awareness and sensitisation on most frequent risks and coping mechanisms
- Development of an inter-agency contingency plan for large-scale disasters
- DMTP workshop for Albania held in October 2002
