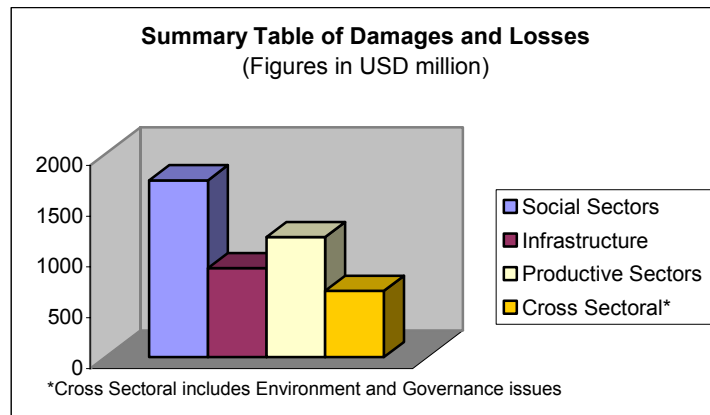

Situation Overview

Main Sectors Affected

A preliminary damage assessment finds that Aceh and northern Sumatra will face significant challenges in recovering from the devastating effects of the tsunami. The report, prepared by the Indonesian government, the Asian Development Bank, the World Bank, and the United Nations, estimates total damages and losses amount to **\$4.5 billion** – almost equal to the entire GDP of Aceh. The assessment finds the disaster primarily affected the private sector, undermining many of the assets and activities that support livelihoods – housing, commerce, agriculture, and fisheries. Loss of roads, government buildings, and other **public infrastructure accounted for just 22 percent** of the damages and losses, while the report placed **private sector impacts, including households, at 78 percent** of the total damages.
