Assistance for the Rehabilitation and Reconstruction of Uganda

Report of the Administrator

1. By its decision 80/17 of 26 June 1980 on assistance for the rehabilitation and reconstruction of Uganda, the Governing Council undertook, inter alia, to review the situation of Uganda at its twenty-eighth session and requested the Administrator to prepare, for that purpose, a report on the implementation of UNDP assistance to Uganda.
2. The assistance that UNDP has been giving to Uganda has been based on requests for emergency, short-term inputs for the rehabilitation and reconstruction of certain aspects of the country's administrative and socio-economic infrastructure and services. They were submitted to the Administrator by an interim Government which has since been replaced following the elections in early December 1980.
3. A new Government has since been installed and the Administrator has been consulting with it, and with the new President of Uganda, with a view to ascertaining the development priorities and technical assistance needs of the country on short and long-term bases. The Administrator visited Uganda on 1 to 3 March 1981 for this purpose and intends to report orally to the June 1981 Governing Council on the outcome of these negotiations which will obviously affect the nature and volume of the assistance of UNDP to that country.
