Knowledge mapping is an important practice consisting of survey, audit, and synthesis. It also aims to track the acquisition and loss of information and knowledge. However, in workshop setting like this, the host (UNDP) brings together experts and practitioners of a field, and asks them to list their best knowledge sources -knowledge collection-. This is a kind of good practice selection process (snapshot), resulting in better understanding of the most relevant and important stuff -knowledge building.
