

Vision and Thematic Focus


The Fund has contributed **\$23 million** towards ten country projects and five global projects that seek to improve livelihoods of the **poor and vulnerable**.

Sharing the Republic of Korea's successful path to development

The Republic of Korea (ROK) has a unique development story to share – one of transformation from aid recipient to donor. From 1945 to the late 1990s, the Republic of Korea received US **\$12 billion** in foreign assistance, of which around US **\$80 million** came from UNDP.

In November 2009, the ROK-UNDP Millennium Development Goal (MDG) Trust Fund and the UNDP Seoul Policy Centre for Global Development Partnerships were established.

Improving economic livelihoods and MDG-based service delivery for vulnerable groups

Colombia

Training lowest-income and vulnerable populations, particularly internally displaced persons, women, indigenous people and the disabled, for **employment and income generation** opportunities.

Lao PDR

Supporting the Government to build **local infrastructure** and deliver improved, cost-effective MDG-based services for women and youth.

Rwanda

Improving productivity and access of small-, medium-scale and micro-enterprises.

Mongolia

Expanding **water and sanitation** services to the most isolated and impoverished rural groups.

Timor-Leste

Supporting the engagement and integration of cooperatives, self-help groups, household-based producers, and small and medium enterprises. Promoting high impact **social enterprises** and pro-poor value chains.

Nepal

Sustainably increasing incomes and food security in high-risk households facing environment degradation and increasing the percentage of forest covered lands in these communities.

Haiti

Providing vocational training and financial support to **vulnerable women** for employment and business creation.

DRC

Supporting **peace consolidation** in North Kivu by providing basic social services and employment opportunities for youth and former combatants.

Sudan

Training **youth volunteers** to promote local entrepreneurship, access to microfinance, value chains, natural resource management, and climate change adaptation.
