“Support to the development of small family businesses in the Sheki-Zaqatala Economic Zone through ABAD regional centre in Balakan”

The overall objective of the project is to contribute to the socio-economic development of the regions of Azerbaijan through enhancing capacity of the ABAD regional centre in Balakan and fostering the creation of modern and sustainable family businesses in rural areas, and enabling equal opportunities and inclusivity in line with European standards and practices. Through collaboration with and provision of support to the work of “ABAD” public legal entity and selected target families, the project will address the challenges that prevent and impede the development of community-based family businesses and rural entrepreneurship, economic regeneration and job creation in the Sheki-Zaqatala Economic Zone.

The specific objective of the action is to support community-based family businesses to produce high quality competitive value-added products in the Sheki-Zaqatala Economic Zone by focusing on Balakan district.

Through collaboration with and provision of support to the work of “ABAD” public legal entity and selected target families, the project will address the challenges that prevent and impede the development of community-based family businesses and rural entrepreneurship, economic regeneration and job creation in the Sheki-Zaqatala Economic Zone.

Introduction and objective of the services required within the RFQ

Balakan region is considered one of the most resourceful regions of Azerbaijan by its economic potential, natural resources and cultural heritage. The economy of rayon is based on agrarian sector. Main segments of the agriculture are tobacco growing, horticulture, sericulture and corn cultivation. Additionally, cattle breeding, wheat growing, winemaking and fishery are widely practiced.

The volume of gross output in the Balakan region in 2017 increased by 35.9 per cent compared to the previous year and amounted to 196.2 million AZN. Agricultural production worth 69.6 million AZN and industrial products worth 7.6 million AZNs were produced in the district and construction works were carried out at 43.7 million AZNs. Production output in the agrarian sector increased by 11.2 per cent compared to 2016 and the volume of construction works by 4.9 times. In 2017, AZN 52.4 million was invested in the economy of the region. The total volume of investments directed to the economy of the region during the 4 years since the adoption of the State Program on the socio-economic development of the regions in 2014-2018 amounted to 96 million AZNs. 1427 new jobs have been created in 2017 with 927 permanent ones in the region.

In 2016, 11 tons of barley was produced in the region. 131.5 thousand mulberry trees have been planted in the district in order to strengthen the feed base of silk cocoons. In 2016, Balakan farmers cultivated tobacco in 528 hectares and produced 317.4 tons of dry tobacco. In the region in 2017 new nuts of 1666 hectares have been laid.

The project is realized through the ABAD regional office in Balakan. Many potential beneficiaries had applied for participation in the project and most of them were women. Balakan has interesting knitting traditions but rug weaving tradition has almost died. Many women wanted to have professional trainings and to be able to sell carpet souvenirs. Women are traditionally very active in Balakan and community initiatives are strong. For example, the future entrepreneurs from Balakan is ready not only to engage in carpet weaving herself, but also to provide work for her acquaintances. Many women dream of developing small business and cooperating with others. The project support some of them who best meets the project requirements.

A future entrepreneur from Balakan is a sculptor and woodcarver. He works with his family and encourages youngsters from his neighbourhood to learn basic craftsmanship. Another future entrepreneur is a woodcarver with a special sympathy for pyrography as well. With some new designs, his wooden souvenirs can be one of the bestsellers in the souvenir market. Also there are more future entrepreneurs who are involved woodworking and carpenting. They craft beautiful figures and souvenirs, but their scale is large. With the help of some tools he can make small wooden souvenirs easier to sell. Apart from woodcarving there is a family which is involved in making quite a unique handcrafting art: dolls. They need some quality material to train on and specific trainings from masters. They started with embroidery and clothing for small souvenir dolls, and moved on the dolls' body and face later. Quite few people in the country are specialized in this art and it is one of the field in the souvenir market which faces minimum competition.

The Sheki region, one of the largest agricultural and industrial districts of the Republic, has a total area of 2.43 thousand sq. Km and a population of 184,172. 49.8% of the population is male, 50.2% - women. 37.0 per cent live in the city and 63.0 per cent live in the village. The population density is 76 people per square kilometer.

At present, the number of employed people in the region is 86,115, including 47,200 in agriculture, 2100 in industry, 750 in construction, 7,853 in education, 2391 in healthcare, 1900 in culture, and 23,921 in other fields.

According to the preliminary reports in the main production areas in 2016, goods worth AZN 323823.4 thousand were issued at actual prices of 1758 AZN per capita. Production at actual prices in 2016 is 107.9 per cent compared to the same period of 2015. In particular, production output in the industry amounted to 21547,0 thousand AZN, agriculture - 152319,4 thousand AZN, construction works - 17081,2 thousand AZN, transport and warehouse - 6544,0 thousand AZNs, information and communication - 1762,7 thousand AZNs, wholesale and retail trade, 124569,1 thousand AZNs on sale and repair of cars, motorcycles, household goods. The retail turnover was 347958,3 thousand AZNs, the volume of paid services rendered to the population was 81524,6 thousand AZNs.

Gross product output increased by 6 times in 2016; 7 times in industrial production and 4.5 times in agro-crop production compared to 2003. Investments in fixed assets increased by 10 times to AZN 31282.3 thousand, including construction and installation works by 6.9 times and totalled AZN 17081.2 thousand;

Through the National Entrepreneurship Support Fund, 459 entrepreneurship subjects were provided with 28.03 million AZNs in the Sheki region, including 339.5 thousand AZNs on 33 entrepreneurship subjects in 2016.

2978 permanent jobs have been created in the region in 2016. Generally, 18834 new jobs were created in the region during 2003-2016, of which 94.4 per cent were permanent jobs. The average monthly wage for the region was 256 AZN. 30 new school buildings were built in the district during 2003-2016. 29 industrial enterprises (21 of which are small enterprises) are operating in the region.

Main problems described as market entry and predomination of seasonal jobs.

Sheki is famous for its masters throughout the country. Shebeke (stained glass craft), art, ceramics, silk and woodworking are the main fields of handicrafts.

Supported families:

Two families of wood craftsmen are supported in Shaki. Willing to bring modern design into their traditional works and skills, and demanding some modern equipment, those families want to spread this art not only within the family, but to the younger generations as well. Another family in which two sisters are engaged in handcrafting is involved in ceramics. One of the family member will be supported by minor tools and professional trainings in ceramics art, another - a young painter who works with his friends, is very talented and makes excellent souvenirs. With high-quality brushes, polymer and acrylic dyes she'll be able to generate sufficient income to procure materials for next souvenir orders. Some professional trainings are important, though.

Zaqatala is famous for its Hazelnuts and Walnuts. Mulberry trees are well adapted to the area, allowing Zaqatala to preserve the ancient tradition of silkworm breeding. The economy of the Zaqatala rayon has an agricultural base - mainly cash-crops and sheep. There is a tea factory, a tobacco transformation plant, a large food plant and a silk cocoon drying plant. The local honey is known across Azerbaijan.

The basis of the district economy is agriculture. The region has grown grain, tobacco, fruits, flowering, tea, melon and vegetable growing and livestock. 55.7 per cent or 75.2 thousand hectares of the region constitute useful land for agriculture.

The region also has a processing industry. Of the 27 industrial enterprises, 78.1 per cent are engaged in the processing industry. The food industry accounts for 81.0 per cent of the industry's output.

Zaqatala region has rich natural resources. The region has considerable potential for the development of tourism, furniture industry, construction industry, hunting, medicinal plants supply and processing industry.

More than 37.8 per cent of the total area and over 51,000 hectares are forested areas. In the forests, there are reserves of 4.5-6 million cubic meters of wood. 85% of the available forests are located in the mountainous area, with exceptional importance as a source of water, soap, air purifier and aesthetic beauty.

In the forests of Zaqatala, valuable species of wood are chestnuts, walnuts, elder candles, white candles, oak, peanuts, hawthorn, lime, iron, brown and so on. There are some types of trees that can be used in the furniture industry. Limestone, sand, clay, tea stone, etc. in the region to develop the building materials industry, which has the potential to improve the production of asphalt, cement, silicate brick, and reinforced concrete products in the region.

The rich natural landscape and untreated forest areas can offer favourable prospects for tourism development. There are indisputable natural corners (Qabizda, Honzakor Mountain, Halakhi Lake, Moorçay, Malarasa Extension, etc.), which can be a source of interesting leisure for both national and foreign citizens. The Zaqatala State Reserve (47.4 thousand hectares), the first preserved natural reserve in Transcaucasia (1929) and the richest flora and fauna, is indispensable for the development of ecotourism.

Zaqatala has long craftsmanship traditions many of which are unique in the region. Silver and bead jewelry, musical instruments and wood figures are the main areas of locals' talents application.

Supported families:

An entrepreneur with her daughters is specialized on bead work, knitting, painting on stone and they make excellent works. However, lack of good quality materials and modern design and some specific skills, as well as the absence of marketing support do not let her enter the touristic market in Azerbaijan. She's very talented and definitely can make some of the best-selling souvenirs and bead jewellery with support of the project.

SPECIFICATION FOR CARPET/RUG LOOMS, TOOLS AND THREADS

All yarn colours must be submitted before delivery.

The delivery and unloading shall be done to the Balakan district and region's villages regions by the Supplier.

The carpet looms must be traditional looms with wooden and metal parts which allow to weave one sided double knotted traditional Azerbaijani carpets and rugs. The construction itself shall have traditional Azerbaijani loom details (Qol (2 ea.); Ox (2 ea.); Side trees (2 ea.); Vərangalan (1 ea.); Çubuq (2 ea.); Külü tree (ea.) (indicated in Azeri language as there is no alternative translation in English).

Looms have to be vertical, warp and carpet must be able to be rolled up on both beams making it possible to let out new warp as work progress.

This is a lump-sum contract all-inclusive cost must be included in the proposal.

General Terms and Conditions

1. ACCEPTANCE OF THE PURCHASE ORDER

This Purchase Order may only be accepted by the Supplier's signing and returning an acknowledgement copy of it or by timely delivery of the goods in accordance with the terms of this Purchase Order, as herein specified. Acceptance of this Purchase Order shall effect a contract between the Parties under which the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be governed solely by the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including these General Conditions. No additional or inconsistent provisions proposed by the Supplier shall bind UNDP unless agreed to in writing by a duly authorized official of UNDP.

2. PAYMENT

2.1 UNDP shall, on fulfillment of the Delivery Terms, unless otherwise provided in this Purchase Order, make payment within 30 days of receipt of the Supplier's invoice for the goods and copies of the shipping documents specified in this Purchase Order.

2.2 Payment against the invoice referred to above will reflect any discount shown under the payment terms of this Purchase Order, provided payment is made within the period required by such payment terms.

2.3 Unless authorized by UNDP, the Supplier shall submit one invoice in respect of this Purchase Order, and such invoice must indicate the Purchase Order's identification number.

2.4 The prices shown in this Purchase Order may not be increased except by express written agreement of UNDP.

3. TAX EXEMPTION

3.1 Section 7 of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations provides, inter alia, that the United Nations, including its subsidiary organs, is exempt from all direct taxes, except charges for utilities services, and is exempt from customs duties and charges of a similar nature in respect of articles imported or exported for its official use. In the event any governmental authority refuses to recognize UNDP's exemption from such taxes, duties or charges, the Supplier shall immediately consult with UNDP to determine a mutually acceptable procedure.

3.2 Accordingly, the Supplier authorizes UNDP to deduct from the Supplier's invoice any amount representing such taxes, duties or charges, unless the Supplier has consulted with UNDP before the payment thereof and UNDP has, in each instance, specifically authorized the Supplier to pay such taxes, duties or charges under protest. In that event, the Supplier

shall provide UNDP with written evidence that payment of such taxes, duties or charges has been made and appropriately authorized.

4. RISK OF LOSS

Risk of loss, damage to or destruction of the goods shall be governed in accordance with Incoterms 2010, unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties on the front side of this Purchase Order.

5. EXPORT LICENCES

Notwithstanding any INCOTERM 2010 used in this Purchase Order, the Supplier shall obtain any export licences required for the goods.

6. FITNESS OF GOODS/PACKAGING

The Supplier warrants that the goods, including packaging, conform to the specifications for the goods ordered under this Purchase Order and are fit for the purposes for which such goods are ordinarily used and for purposes expressly made known to the Supplier by UNDP, and are free from defects in workmanship and materials. The Supplier also warrants that the goods are contained or packaged adequately to protect the goods.

7. INSPECTION

7.1 UNDP shall have a reasonable time after delivery of the goods to inspect them and to reject and refuse acceptance of goods not conforming to this Purchase Order; payment for goods pursuant to this Purchase Order shall not be deemed an acceptance of the goods.

7.2 Inspection prior to shipment does not relieve the Supplier from any of its contractual obligations.

8. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INFRINGEMENT

The Supplier warrants that the use or supply by UNDP of the goods sold under this Purchase Order does not infringe any patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark. In addition, the Supplier shall, pursuant to this warranty, indemnify, defend and hold UNDP and the United Nations harmless from any actions or claims brought against UNDP or the United Nations pertaining to the alleged infringement of a patent, design, trade-name or trade-mark arising in connection with the goods sold under this Purchase Order.

9. RIGHTS OF UNDP

In case of failure by the Supplier to fulfil its obligations under the terms and conditions of this Purchase Order, including but not limited to failure to obtain necessary export licences, or to make delivery of all or part of the goods by the agreed delivery date or dates, UNDP may, after giving the Supplier reasonable notice to perform and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, exercise one or more of the following rights:

- 9.1 Procure all or part of the goods from other sources, in which event UNDP may hold the Supplier responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.
- 9.2 Refuse to accept delivery of all or part of the goods.
- 9.3 Cancel this Purchase Order without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

10. LATE DELIVERY

Without limiting any other rights or obligations of the parties hereunder, if the Supplier will be unable to deliver the goods by the delivery date(s) stipulated in this Purchase Order, the Supplier shall (i) immediately consult with UNDP to determine the most expeditious means for delivering the goods and (ii) use an expedited means of delivery, at the Supplier's cost (unless the delay is due to Force Majeure), if reasonably so requested by UNDP.

11. ASSIGNMENT AND INSOLVENCY

- 11.1. The Supplier shall not, except after obtaining the written consent of UNDP, assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of this Purchase Order, or any part thereof, or any of the Supplier's rights or obligations under this Purchase Order.
- 11.2. Should the Supplier become insolvent or should control of the Supplier change by virtue of insolvency, UNDP may, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies, immediately terminate this Purchase Order by giving the Supplier written notice of termination.

12. USE OF UNDP OR UNITED NATIONS NAME OR EMBLEM

The Supplier shall not use the name, emblem or official seal of UNDP or the United Nations for any purpose.

13. PROHIBITION ON ADVERTISING

The Supplier shall not advertise or otherwise make public that it is furnishing goods or services to UNDP without specific permission of UNDP in each instance.

14. CHILD LABOUR

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is engaged in any practice inconsistent with the rights set forth in the Convention on the Rights of the Child, including Article 32 thereof, which, inter alia, requires that a child shall be protected from performing any work that is likely to be hazardous or to interfere with the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health or physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

15. MINES

The Supplier represents and warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates is actively and directly engaged in patent activities, development, assembly, production, trade or manufacture of mines or in such activities in respect of components primarily utilized in the manufacture of Mines. The term "Mines" means those devices defined in Article 2, Paragraphs 1, 4 and 5 of Protocol II annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions and Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects of 1980.

Any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate this Purchase Order immediately upon notice to the Supplier, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind of UNDP.

16. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

16.1 Amicable Settlement. The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of, or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof. Where the Parties wish to seek such an amicable settlement through conciliation, the conciliation shall take place in accordance with the UNCITRAL Conciliation Rules then obtaining, or according to such other procedure as may be agreed between the Parties.

16.2 Arbitration. Unless, any such dispute, controversy or claim between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Purchase Order or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof is settled amicably under the preceding paragraph of this Section within sixty (60) days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's request for such amicable settlement, such dispute, controversy or claim shall be referred by either Party to arbitration in accordance with the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules then obtaining, including its provisions on applicable law. The arbitral tribunal shall have no authority to award punitive damages. The Parties shall be bound by any arbitration award rendered as a result of such arbitration as the final adjudication of any such controversy, claim or dispute.

17. PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES

Nothing in or related to these General Terms and Conditions or this Purchase Order shall be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of the United Nations, including its subsidiary organs.

18. SEXUAL EXPLOITATION:

18.1 The Contractor shall take all appropriate measures to prevent sexual exploitation or abuse of anyone by it or by any of its employees or any other persons who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract. For these purposes, sexual activity with any person less than eighteen years of age, regardless of any laws relating to consent, shall constitute the sexual exploitation and abuse of such person. In addition, the Contractor shall refrain from, and shall take all appropriate measures to prohibit its employees or other persons engaged by it from, exchanging any money, goods, services, offers of employment or other things of value, for sexual favors or activities, or from engaging in any sexual activities that are exploitive or degrading to any person. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the provisions hereof constitute an essential term of the Contract and that any breach of this representation and warranty shall entitle UNDP to terminate the Contract immediately upon notice to the Contractor, without any liability for termination charges or any other liability of any kind.

18.2 UNDP shall not apply the foregoing standard relating to age in any case in which the Contractor's personnel or any other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract is married to the person less than the age of eighteen years with whom sexual activity has occurred and in which such marriage is recognized as valid under the laws of the country of citizenship of such Contractor's personnel or such other person who may be engaged by the Contractor to perform any services under the Contract.

19.0 OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT:

The Contractor warrants that no official of UNDP or the United Nations has received or will be offered by the Contractor any direct or indirect benefit arising from this Contract or the award thereof. The Contractor agrees that breach of this provision is a breach of an essential term of this Contract.

20. AUTHORITY TO MODIFY:

Pursuant to the Financial Regulations and Rules of UNDP, only the UNDP Authorized Official possess the authority to agree on behalf of UNDP to any modification of or change in this Agreement, to a waiver of any of its provisions or to any additional contractual relationship of any kind with the Contractor. Accordingly, no modification or change in this Contract shall be valid

and enforceable against UNDP unless provided by an amendment to this Agreement signed by the Contractor and jointly by the UNDP Authorized Official.
