## UNDP'S INTEGRATED APPROACH



### TOTAL BENEFICIARIES

**11,187,937**

In all governorates across Yemen



### COVID-19 Community Outreach

**9,130,000**

Yemenis received information through radio campaigns and UNDP's social media platforms: Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.

**155,000+**

COVID-19 awareness-raising posters and leaflets printed and distributed to communities across Yemen.

**264,000**

Yemenis received information through rural household campaigns.



### Economic and Livelihood Support

**150,000**

women from rural, low socio-economic areas supported with cash transfers and door-to-door nutrition and COVID-19 awareness to allow purchase of food and essential goods.

**25,000**

people participated in short-term employment, enabling the purchase of essential goods and PPE for close to 150,000 family members.

**6,000**

smallholder farmers, fishermen, and livestock breeders benefitted from cash assistance, technical support, and COVID-19 awareness.



### Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprise (MSMEs) Support

**103**

micro-businesses established, including 37 for mask production and 16 for soap,<sup>1</sup> resulting in the production of 10,000 masks, 200 hospital gowns, and 100 face shields.

**First ever B2B**

**e-commerce** platform developed, enabling rural and urban businesses to connect digitally with one another and with buyers.

**In total, UNDP-supported MSMEs have produced 57,800 non-surgical masks, 360 hospital gowns, and 354 litres of liquid soap with revenue over YER 11.8 million (US\$ 19,700)**



### Security, Law, and Justice Institutions Support

**100+**

security, law, justice, and correctional facilities received hygiene kits and PPE in 21 governorates<sup>2</sup> benefitting 39,300 people.

**3,100**

Coast Guard personnel in both Aden and Hodeidah received PPE.

**300**

security and justice officials were taught COVID-19 preventative measures.<sup>3</sup>

### Health System Support

**757,000**

people benefitted from 10 handwashing stations (200 litres each) distributed to 8 health centers in Aden, Hadramout, and Lahj.

**20,000**

people benefitted from 40 public toilets and hand washing stations with COVID-19 awareness posters in crowded urban centers.<sup>4</sup>

**36**

off-grid vaccine refrigerators were installed along with remote monitoring devices for rural health centers in Abyan, Lahj, and Taiz.

**9**

COVID-19 Isolation Centers and three (3) healthcare centers<sup>5</sup> provided off-grid solar energy systems in Sana'a.
