As a result of conflict, explosives can be found in large areas of land throughout Yemen – including areas where the majority of the population lives. Reaching those who require the most assistance demands particular care and planning.

Objective

The Emergency Mine Action Project is designed to reduce the impact of explosive remnants of war and mines on people and communities.

Value

In the short term, interventions mitigate and reduce risks to communities and households. In the longer term, they will help make the country safer and create an environment in which normal social and economic activities can be resumed.

Activities

The Emergency Mine Action Project uses both preventative and responsive measures, including land mine clearance, risk education and assistance to survivors. It also builds capacity of the National Mine Action Committee (NMAC) and Yemeni Executive Mine Action Center (YEMAC) to protect people and communities.
