On-going conflict has pushed Yemen deeper into poverty and increased the vulnerability of its people. There are now ten million people on the brink of famine; and more than half of the population lives on less than US\$1.90 per day. Almost half the population has no access to safe drinking water and, in rural areas, less than one quarter is connected to an even partially-functioning water network.

Objective

The Social Protection for Community Resilience project is designed enhance economic resilience; improve access to health care services including psychological support; and strengthen capacity of local authorities to deliver basic services.

Value

The project is anticipated to result in greater household incomes; improved healthcare facilities; stronger psycho-social assistance; and better equipped service providers.

Activities

Project activities include income-generation activities; repair or replacement of community assets; community-based social support projects; and capacity development of local authorities; and encouragement of inclusivity.
