(ERRY III) is a 3-year programme co-funded by the European Union (EU) and Government of Sweden.


### **Objectives**


The overall objective is that crisis affected communities are better able to manage local risks and shocks for increased resilience and self-reliance.






# **IMPACT SO FAR**



326 Village Cooperative Councils (VCCs) established or reactivated to define community needs







50 Sub-district Development Committees (SDCs) formed in 11 districts



612 SDC members, including 325 women, trained as mediators



716 SDC members trained in resilience planning, including 47% women



73 community consultants, including 29 women, received training in social cohesion and mediation



50 Community **Resilience Plans** (CRPs) developed at the sub-district level



35 conflict scans conducted in 35 sub-districts to address conflicts effectively



308 Community **Resilience Plans** (CRPs) developed at the village level



55 community dialogues conducted to resolve conflicts peacefully



407 self-help initiatives implemented at the village level



36 community members trained in solar systems operation and maintenance



35 compact initiatives are being implemented



15 public services including schools, healthcare facilities were provided with solar energy systems













# **IMPACT SO FAR**







29 community-based assets established through C4W activities of UNDP livelihoods component



50 Community Animal **Health Workers** (CAHW) trained and provided with veterinary kits with support of FAO



Over 3,350 people, including, 38% women, generated income through emergency employment



30 crops, livestock, dairy farmer field Schools were established with the support of FAO




2 water desalination plants established to help reserve groundwater



44 community assets have been rehabilitated through WFP Food Assistance for Assets (FFA)







A total amount of \$1,174,843 has been transferred to targeted beneficiaries as part of WFP FFA component.



1200 increased their knowledge in business development and life skills through ILO & UNDP Livelihood and Apprenticeship programme



720 of C4W and FFA beneficiaries certified in market-relevant technical skills, with the support of ILO, WFP



1430 of dairy producers supported with training and dairy equipment with support of FAO



6000 farmers provided with inputs (seeds, training, marketing support) to improve agriculture value chains with support of FAO



**1430** dairy producers supported with training and dairy equipment with support of FAO
