# INTEGRATING DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION INTO DEVELOPMENT PLANNING



The interdisciplinary learning offer seeks to develop the capacity of national and regional stakeholders for integrating Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) in development at the national, sectoral and subnational levels to promote risk-informed and sustainable development. This learning offer is designed based on UNDP's 'Strategy Tool for Integrating Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation into Development'. The Strategy Tool aims to build a common understanding of risk-informed development (RID) and help governments to mainstream both disaster and climate risk management in an integrated manner into development policy, planning, budgeting, programming, implementation and M&E.

**Requirements:** This learning offer targets national and/or local level representatives of disaster risk management agencies, climate change, planning, finance departments, as well as sectors such as agriculture and food security, infrastructure, urban planning, education, and others based on demand.

#### The learning objectives:

- Enhance the understanding of the scope and importance of mainstreaming both DRR and CCA jointly into development planning and budgetary processes.
- Generate increased demand and political commitment for integrating DRR and CCA into overall economic and social planning processes for risk-informed development.
- Promote the establishment of human resources & capacity development for leading & implementing disaster and climate risk-informed development planning.
- Agree on follow-up actions to advance climate and disaster risk-informed development in participating countries.
