PROJECT INFORMATION

Phase I of the UN Peace Support Facility (UN PSF) was created to support the national peace process by implementing elements of the 2018 Stockholm Peace Agreement. During its second phase, the UN PSF supported the peace process by aiding the objectives of the UN Special Envoy and Resident Coordinator.

The UN PSF pursues the objectives by supporting the reinstatement of Yemen's peace process with initiatives that deliver tangible, rapid, and lasting impact on Yemenis' daily lives while reinforcing and building local support for the peace process.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

The UN PSF Phase II is a versatile facility supporting emerging opportunities to make progress towards peace. The UN PSF initiatives focus on three mediation tracks – political, military/security, and economic – covering short and longer-term priorities emanating from international mediation efforts between the parties to the conflict, while supporting subnational peacebuilding initiatives that build momentum for peace.

The UN PSF is structured into three result areas:

Result Area 1 supports the Office of the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen and the Resident Coordinator's Office with confidence building interventions and mechanisms.

Result Area 2 supports new – and brings to scale existing – subnational peace initiatives.

Result Area 3 accommodates special initiatives complementary to Result Areas 1 and 2, that promotes broader, more coherent, and inclusive support of the international community to the peace process, and to a potential peace agreement.

IMPACT



Members of the Peacebuilding network at the Women Research and Training Center hosted by Aden University received comprehensive peacebuilding and project management training



12 local initiatives on peacebuilding in five different governorates across Yemen through the facility's Small Grant Mechanism



More than 775 women and men have been trained on conflict resolution and mediation by the participating organizations under the facility's Small Grant Mechanism



Established gender-segregated databases and protocols in the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor, and the Ministry of Justice, to increase women's engagement with authorities



Gender Responsive Action Plans are implemented in 20 police centers in Aden



Increased legitimacy of government security institutions through 120 local forums targeting around 2,000 participants from the security sector



Over 520 security personnel received training on civilian harm mitigation community policing and protection of civilians



Enabled OESGY to monitor a potential ceasefire through the development of a ceasefire mechanism



2 million Yemenis reached through a national advocacy campaign focusing on security issues



Restoring water services in Taiz to over 1400 households



Established a network of civil society organizations to address community safety



11 Community Protection Groups were established across Yemen



Hosted peacebuilding community dialogues for more than a 1,000 local police departments, Ministry of Interior and Ministry of Defense staff



Increased the safety of more than 50,000 students in 50 schools across six governorates through training for education personnel
