Reinforcing peace and stability at a time of polarization

Rising food and energy prices could lead to violent demonstrations in a context where governments have shrinking means to introduce measures to shield their people from the effects of a global inflation. Our efforts in understanding and addressing the complex triggers of instability, in rebuilding trust in the justice systems and magistrates (Lesotho, Guinea Bissau, Liberia), and in restoring social contracts, will need to be reinforced in the coming weeks and months. Fostering greater participation of Africa's youth, media (Guinea Bissau) and civil society in building economic opportunities and preserving peace is amongst our key priorities and our actions in Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Mali, Nigeria and at regional level are showing the way.
