

Background

India is one of the global leaders in taking climate action. Having made significant progress towards its COP21 commitments to the Paris Agreement, India enhanced its climate commitments at COP26 to:



Meet 50% of energy requirements from non-fossil fuel based energy sources by 2030



Reduce emissions intensity of its GDP by 45% by 2030 from 2005 levels



Attain net zero emissions by 2070

To support India's climate action journey, UNDP India is partnering with Government of Japan as a part of the Net Zero Emissions Project being implemented through the Japan Supplementary Budget 2021 across 23 countries. The grant will be used to make strategic interventions in key sectors across 10 states to achieve net zero growth.

Project Description

In India, the project aims at enabling cutting-edge climate technology for transition to low carbon pathways, and for building adaptive capacity of vulnerable communities to adapt to climate change.

Activities will be guided by the overarching ambition to support India's transition to a low carbon economy that ensures sustainable and inclusive growth while ensuring climate resilience of the vulnerable communities.

Most importantly, all project activities will aim at skilling and creating green jobs and climate resilient livelihoods, including:

1 Capacity building of 1,000 youth in green entrepreneurship.

2 Training 1,000 former coal mine workers to support just transition to alternative livelihoods.
