UNDP works in some 170 countries and territories to support our partners to adopt approaches, reform discriminatory laws, and design and implement public policies that advance gender equality and the empowerment of women as the foundation of achieving the global Sustainable Development Goals. We help governments to identify and address the gender dimensions of human development in areas such as poverty, governance, climate and crisis through its extended network of gender experts in five regions across the world.

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Gender-Based Violence

Ending gender-based violence (GBV) is a fundamental part of UNDP's development work to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals in all contexts, including crisis settings. UNDP works with countries to address and prevent GBV, including the surge during the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2020, UNDP provided policy guidance and programme support in more than 80 countries on adapting legal frameworks, designing national action plans for prevention and response, and delivering dedicated services to GBV survivors. This includes the UNDP country offices implementing the [Spotlight Initiative](#), a multi-year partnership between the European Union and the UN to eliminate GBV.

Women's Economic Empowerment

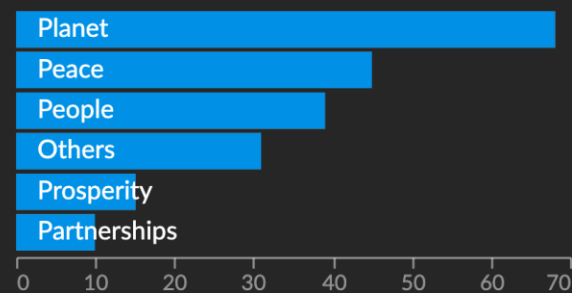
Economic systems and societies must be transformed in order to create long-term women's economic empowerment. UNDP works with governments to develop fiscal and social policies that boost women's economic security, place care at the center of economic development and transform social norms for gender equality. We work with national and local governments, the private sector and civil society to reform segregation of the labour market and improve women's access to and control of green jobs, digitalization, and financial and non-financial assets.

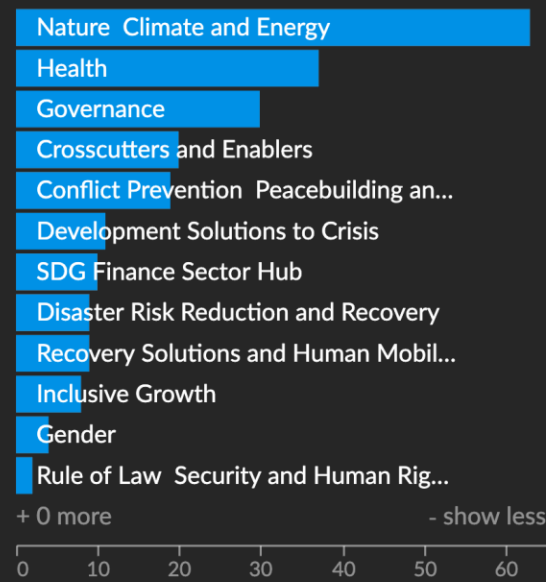

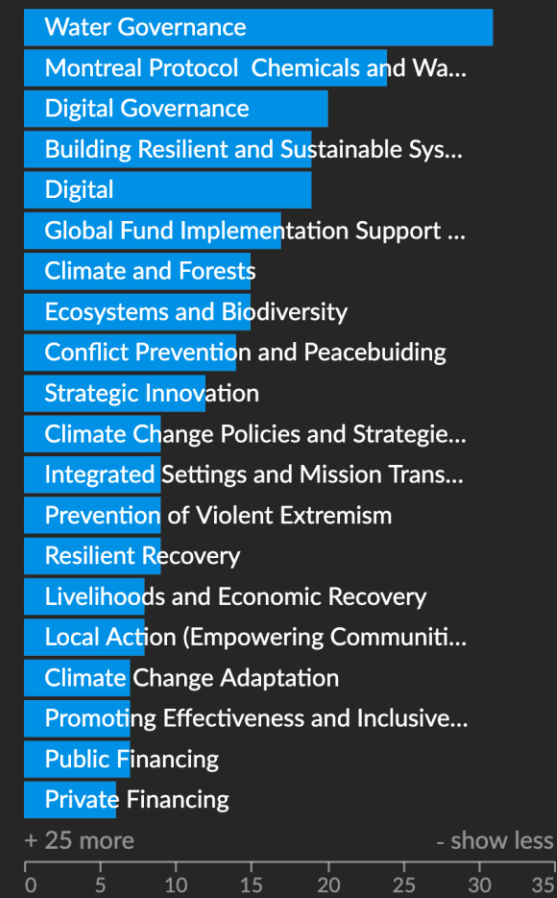
The biggest thematic portfolio is related to Planet.

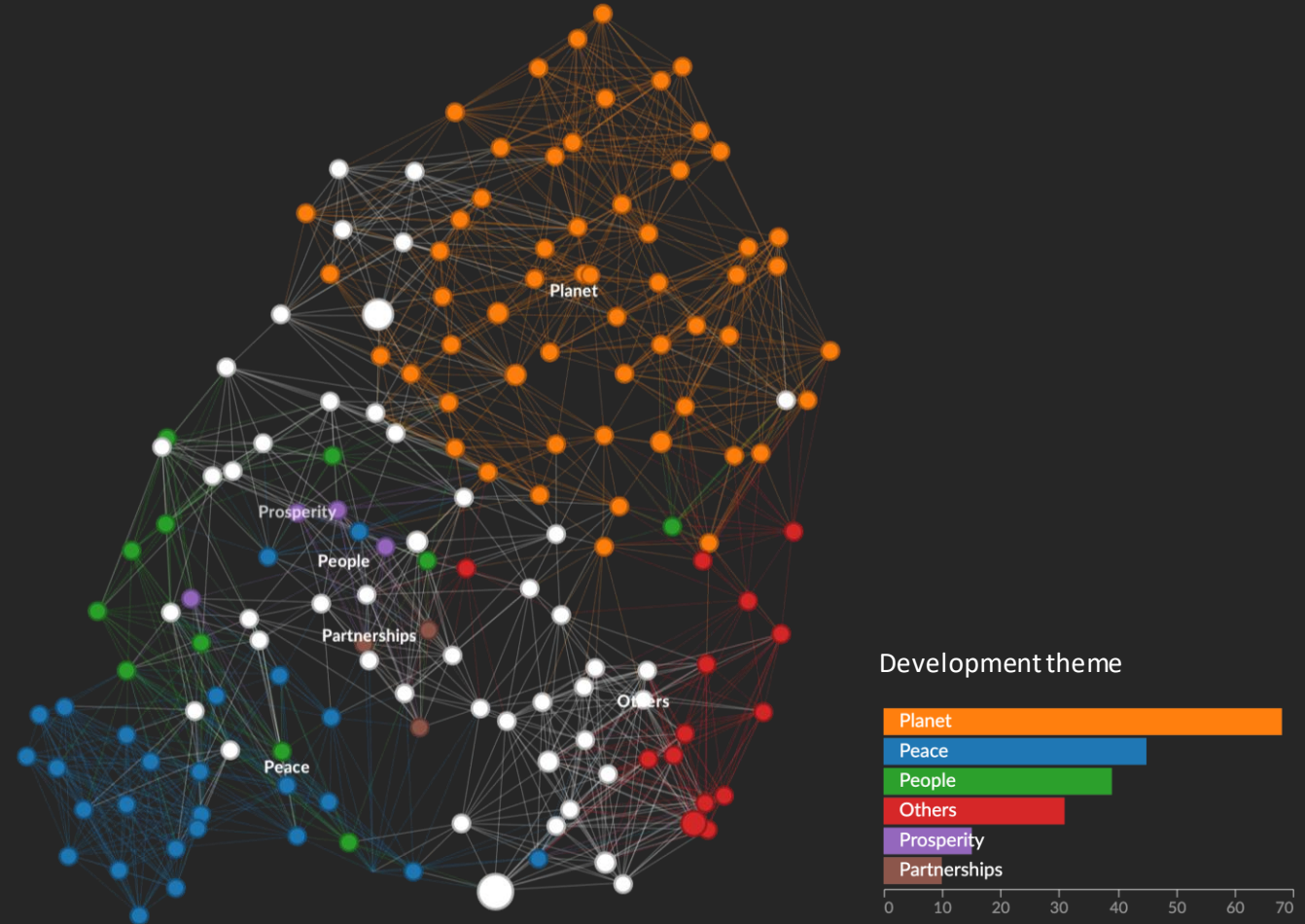
# Connections between portfolios

The portfolio on “Planet” has the biggest size. It has more connections with the portfolio on “People”, but less with the rest.

“People” portfolio is widely spread across network, showing its potential to be the bridge with other thematic portfolios. There are more interactions between the portfolios of “People” and “Peace”, showing the closer connections between the thematic areas they focus on. Work on governance and building resilience are the key bridges between them.

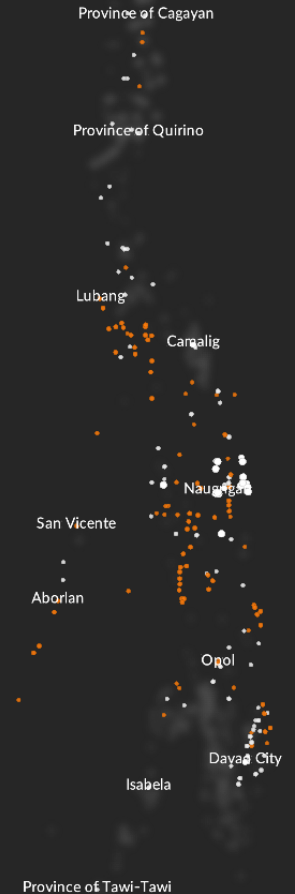
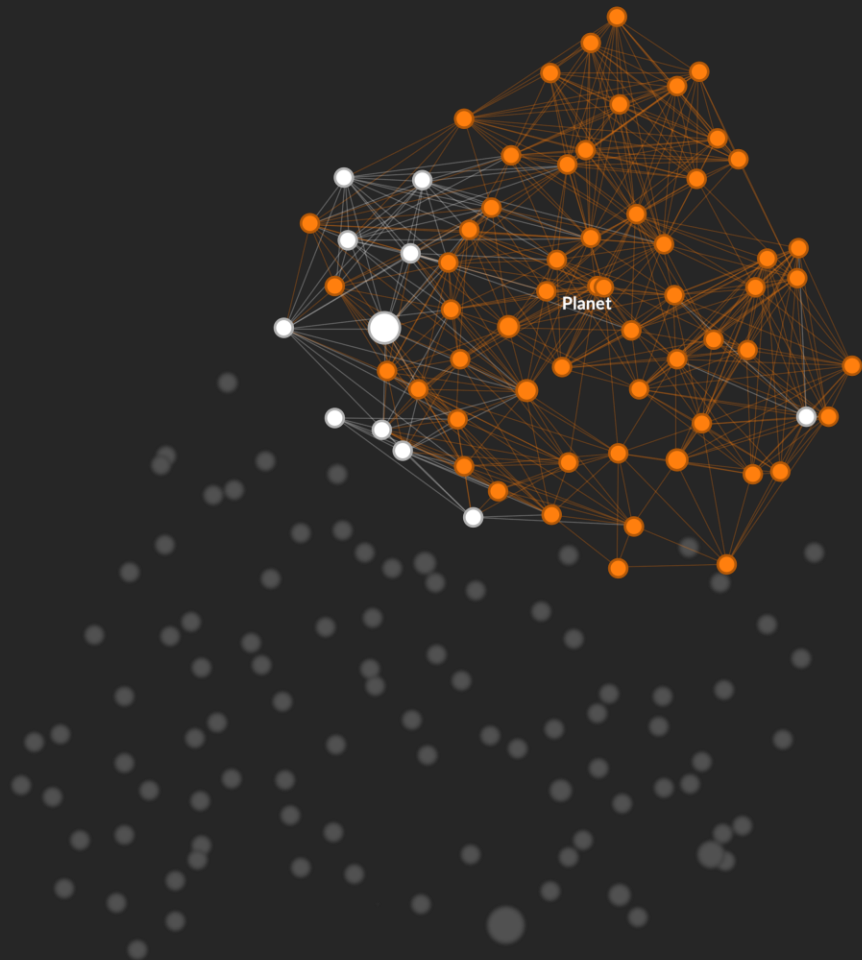
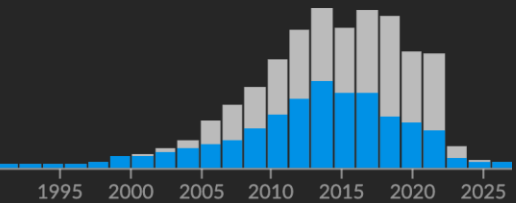
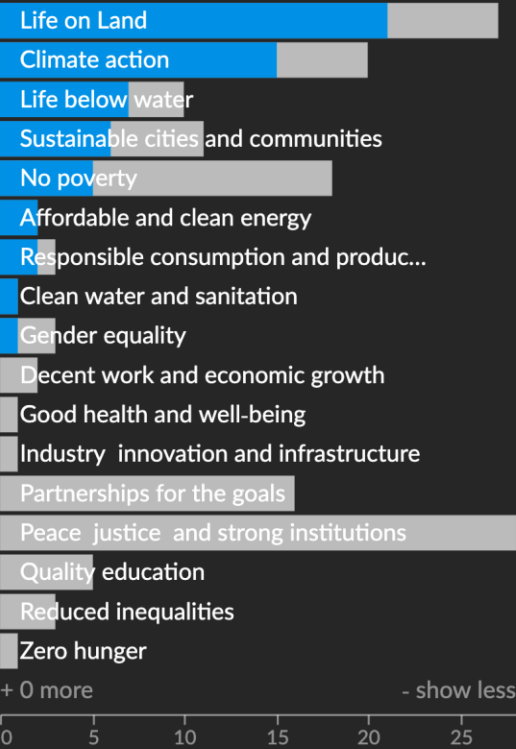
The portfolios on “prosperity” and “partnerships” are in the center of the network, meaning it is playing a brokerage role between different themes. But size of the portfolio is relatively small.

Though the portfolio on “Others” is mainly composed of the “crosscutters and enablers”, its integration role has a potential to be further utilized. It shares more connections with the “Peace” portfolio.



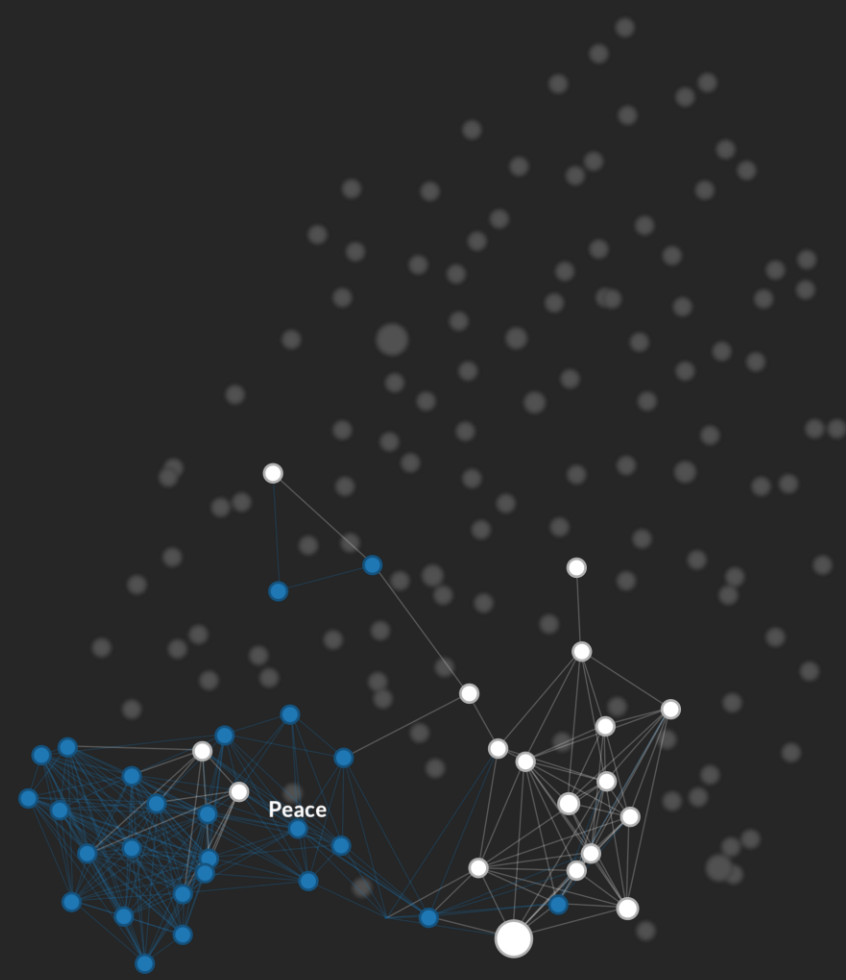
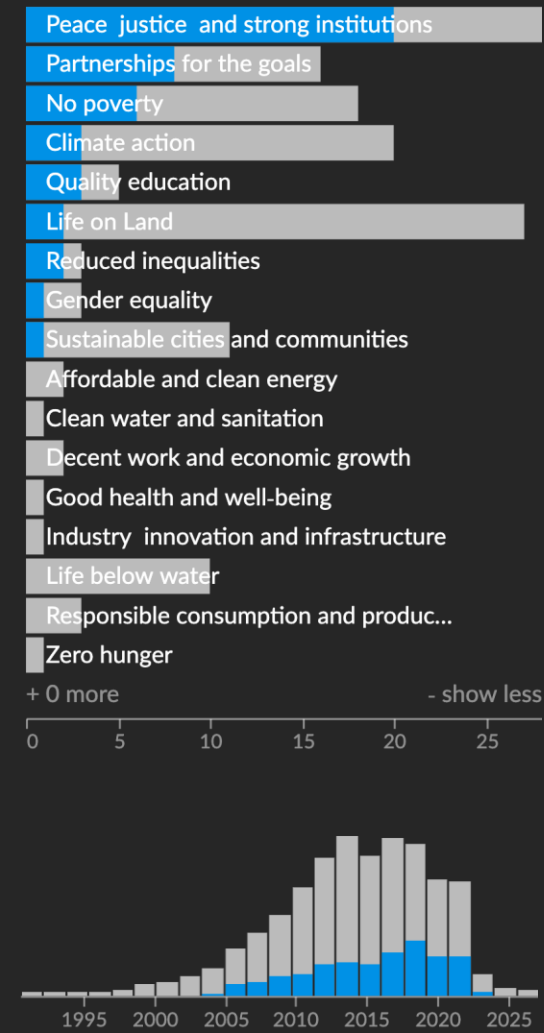

# Budget proposition across thematic portfolios

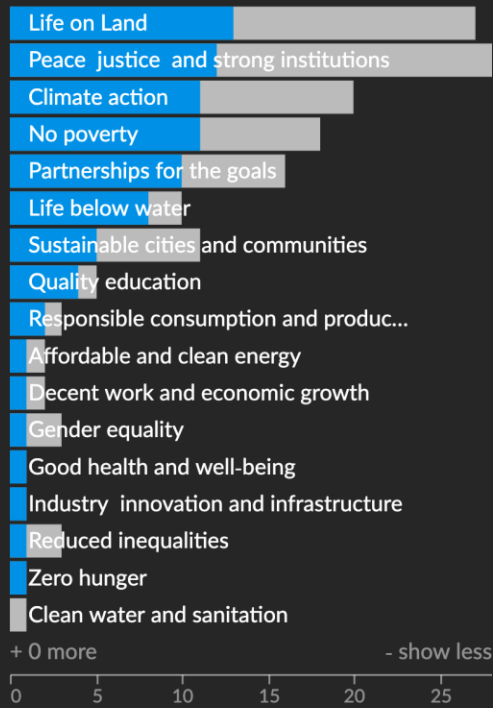


The total budget accumulated by the projects that are active in a particular year is highest in 2019. Breaking down the budget allocation by development theme, the portfolio related to the **Peace** portfolio has been growing overtime and has become one of the largest in the recent years. Budget for the **Planet** portfolio, once the largest in the past, had been increasing before 2020. It has been declining since then. And the **People** portfolio is following a similar trajectory after 2016.

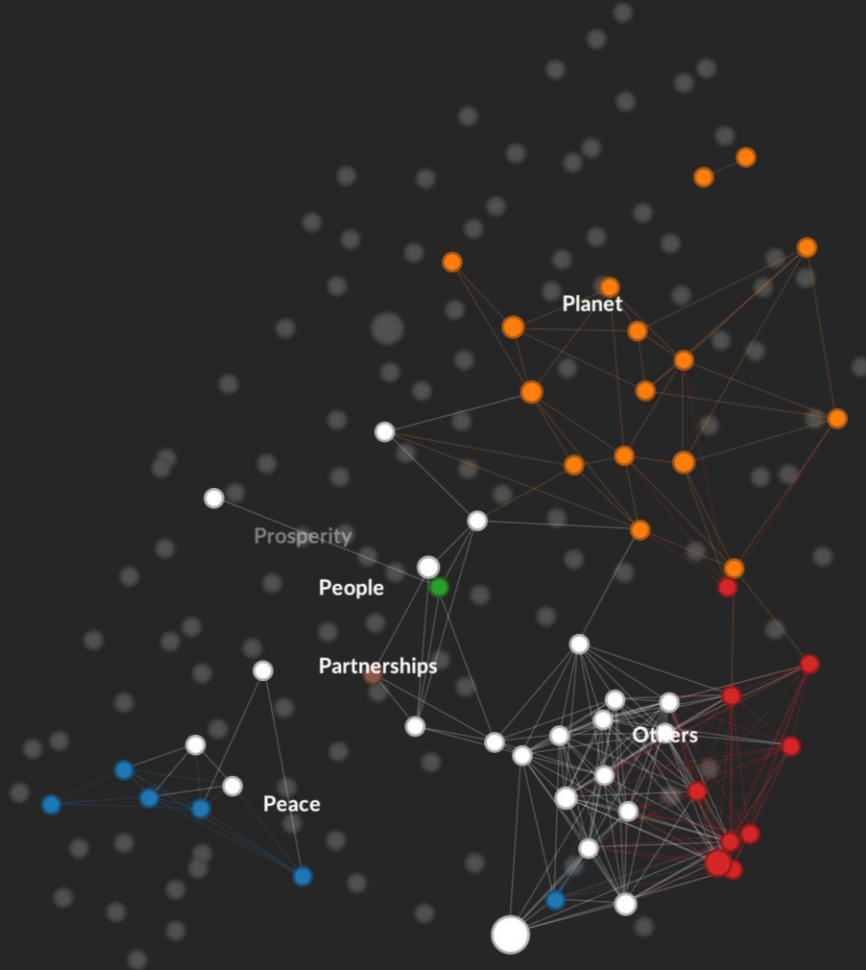
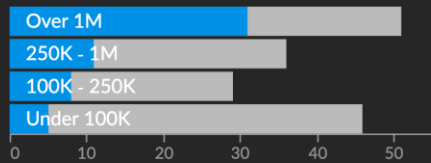
The **Others** portfolio has grown big in the recent years and is reflected in the expansion of budget size. Interesting, its trend is similar to the **Peace** portfolio, implying possible integration between these two portfolios.

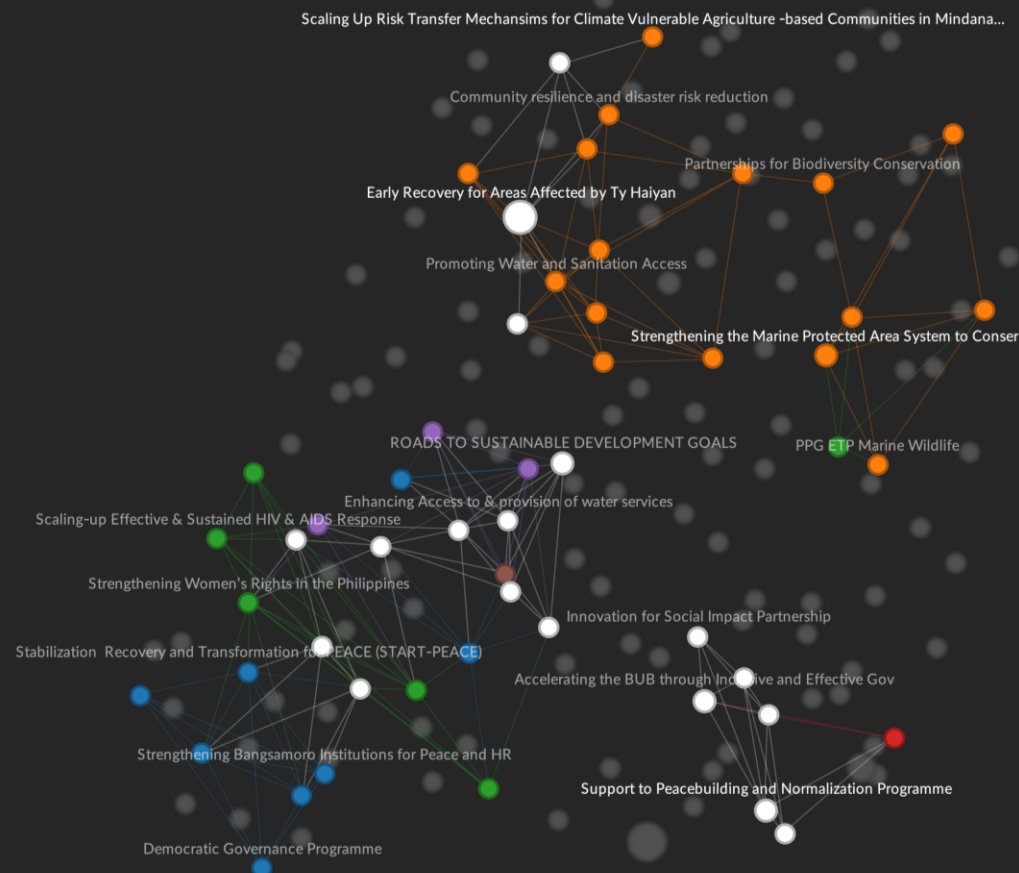
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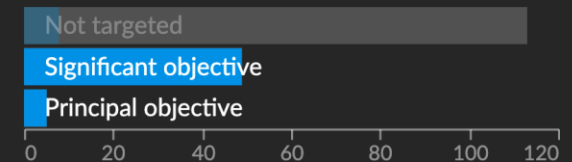
# Portfolio with a gender lens

49 projects set gender equity as "significant objective" and 5 projects set it as "principal objective". The rest of 113 projects are marked as "not targeted".

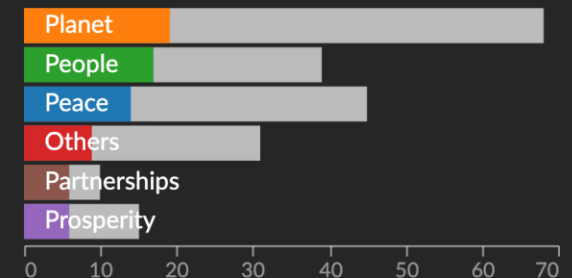
Given the size of Planet portfolio, it has the largest number of projects putting gender equity as significant or principal objectives. Though the Peace portfolio is larger than People portfolio, the latter's gender representation is higher.

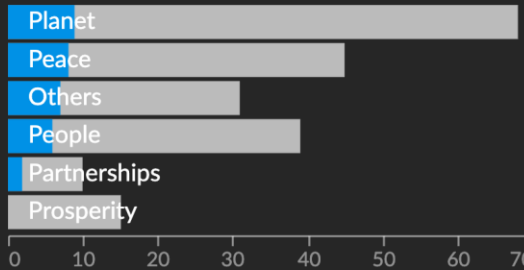

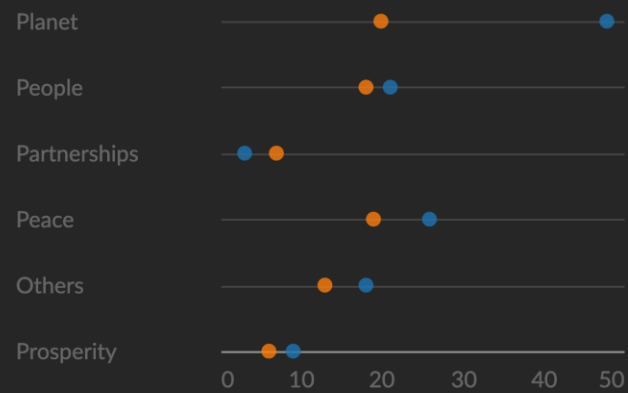

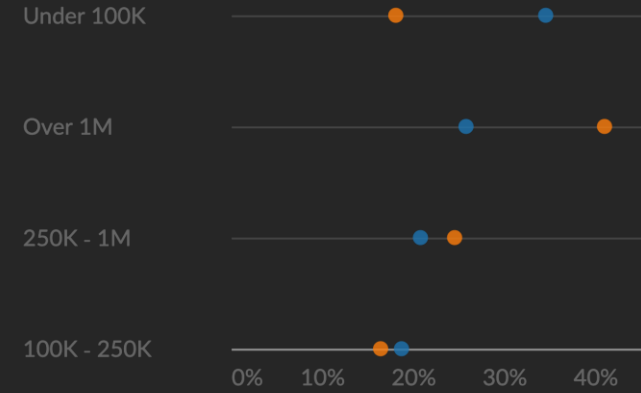
# Portfolio with a gender lens (2020 – 2022)

By theme



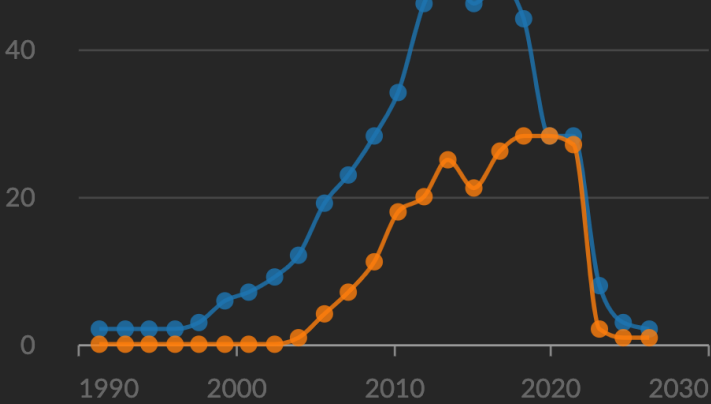
Except for the Partnership portfolio, the number of projects that explicitly mention gender equity in the project description are less than those that don't. And the gap is the largest in the Planet portfolio.

By budget



For projects targeted gender equity, they are mostly distributed in a large budget portfolio (over 250K). Most of the projects which didn't mention gender equity have small budget (under 100K)

By active years



There are less gender equality related projects in the past, though the number of gender equality related projects has been increasing in general.

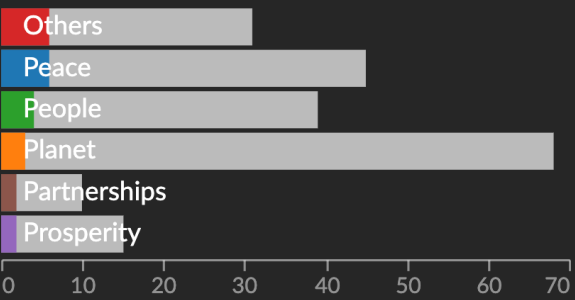

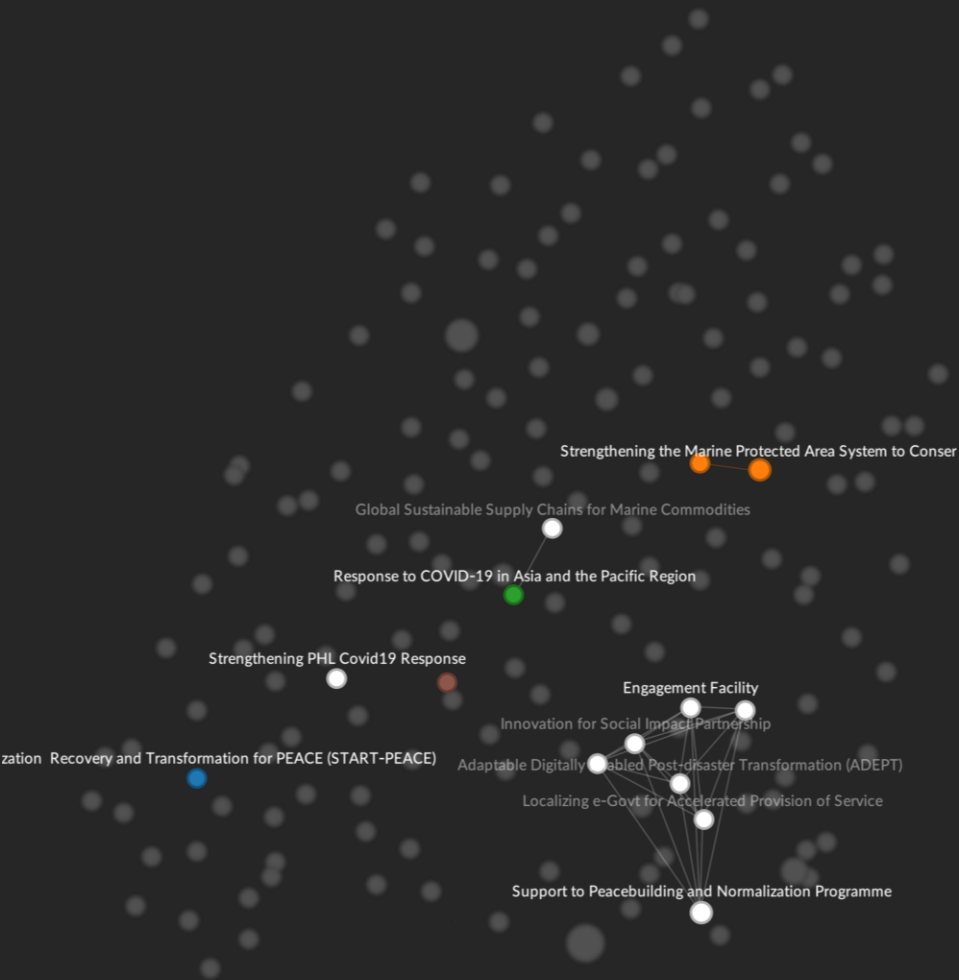

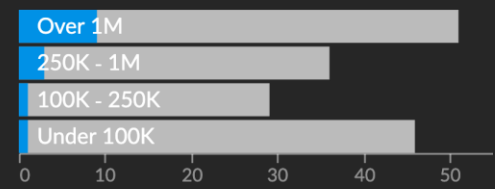
Development theme

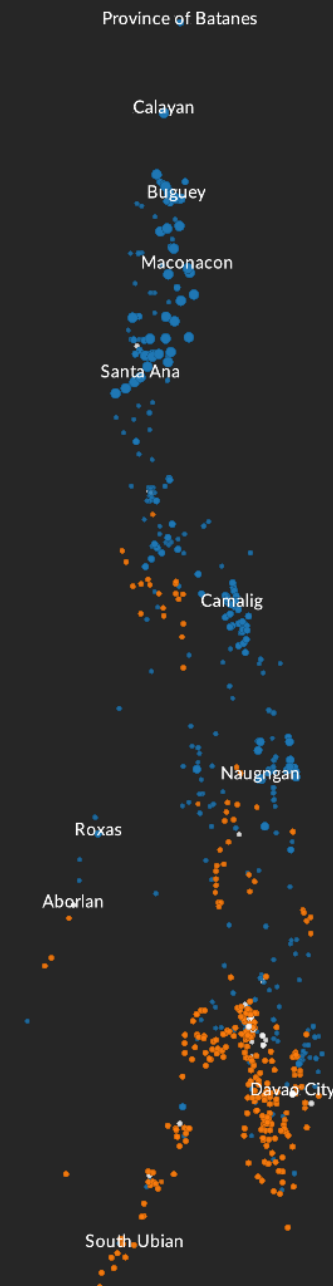
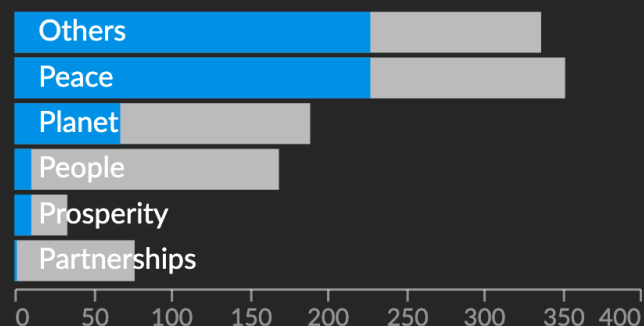
In terms of budget allocation for COVID-19 response, the investment is large in general. Most of projects have funding of more than \$1 million.

# Geographic distribution of COVID-19 response portfolio

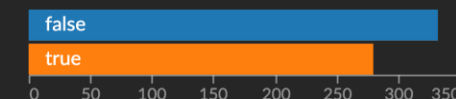
Most of the COVID-19 response are targetting the middle and southern part of the country.

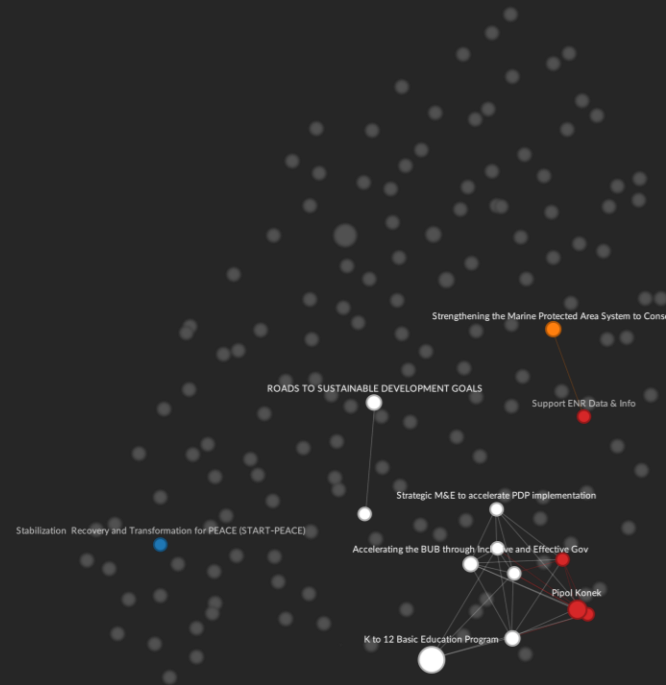

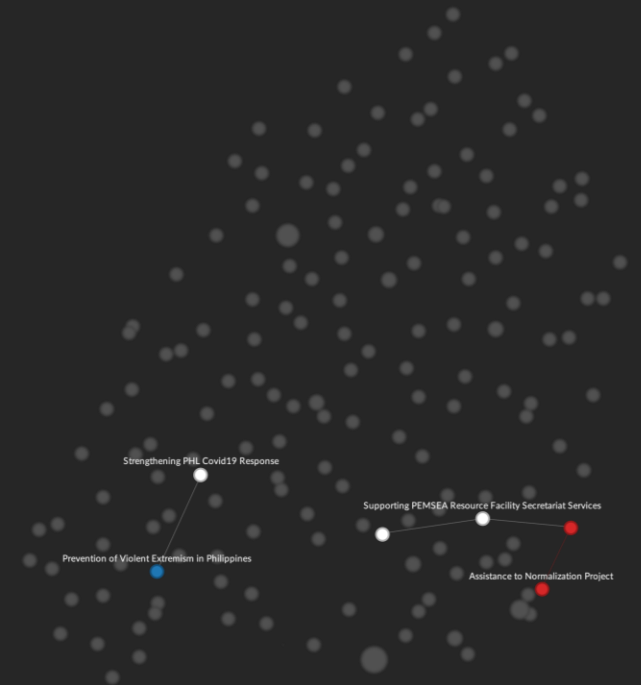
