**ABADEI** puts livelihoods and dignified jobs at the center of the solution, boosting the local economy, restoring service delivery and productivity through community infrastructure, helping build disaster and climate resilience, and enhancing bottom-up, inclusive community engagement and capacities.

**Main activities include** cash for work, unconditional cash transfer, rehabilitation of infrastructure, supporting women enterprises and the private sector, agriculture, access to water, health, education, energy, and social cohesion.

Supporting dignified self-sufficiency of individuals and the community is directly aligned with the UN Transitional Engagement Frame (TEF) for Afghanistan.


**ABADEI is UNDP's commitment to support community resilience and welfare.**

# The ABADEI Strategy has two phases:

## HOW ABADEI TURNS CRISIS INTO DEVELOPMENT GAINS



### Emergency Phase Targets by the end of 2022 (12 months)

Emergency response to safeguard jobs and livelihoods.



Delivery of essential services such as health, water, and electricity



Providing short-term earning opportunities, targeted basic income, and safeguarding livelihoods.



Access to health education, employment, energy, and finance



Creation of jobs in the local community

- Support 500,000 people with renewable energy access.
- Support 50,000 through social protection and cash-for-work schemes.
- Support 5,650,000 people with access to health services including treating malaria, TB and HIV.
- Support five hospitals in five provinces with a provision of incentives and services.

- Support 50,000 women-led enterprises.
- Strengthen the local economy including backing system and digital payments.
- Improve data and analysis on social and economic assessment.



Protecting farmers livelihoods from natural disasters

- 500,000 Afghans benefitting from support to farms through the provision of finance and equipment.



Community Resilience and social cohesion.

- Strengthen the local economy including backing system and digital payments.
- Improve data and analysis on social and economic assessment.
