ENHANCING RETURNEE MIGRANT WORKERS SKILLS FOR EMPLOYMENT KEY SNAPSHOTS

The Enhancing Returnee Migrant Workers Skills for Employment project of UNDP's SKILLS Program has delivered skills training, and equipment support/post-training career counseling to 1612 RMWs in Lumbini and Madhesh Provinces. The project is implemented by the Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) with the support of the British Council-managed Dakchyata Project and funding by the European Union in Nepal.

This project focused on productive employment opportunities in the labour market, particularly for the women, historically disadvantaged, poor and marginalized groups through skills training in three key economic sectors: i) agriculture ii) construction, and iii) tourism. These three sectors offer the most employment/self-employment opportunities for promoting the transition to a greener, climate-resilient and low-emission economy in Nepal.








