The **Gender Equality Seal for Public Institutions** is proved to be an effective and practical tool for supporting countries delivering on Agenda 2023 SDG targets. As 2023, the program is being implemented in **all five regions**, **21 countries and 74 public institutions**, reaching over **85,000 public officers globally**, covering public policy development and implementation in **20 diverse thematic sectors**, from tax administrations to environment ministries.

• In **Africa**, <u>40 gender equality experts from 7 countries</u> are being trained as regional trainers for the Gender Equality Seal for Public Institutions.

Enlightening results

The Silver UNDP Gender Equality Seal was awarded to the Ministry of Transport

in Colombia for institutionalizing gender equality goals and targets, and gender mainstreaming as part of institutional mandates; the engagement with women's civil society organizations for transport policy formulation; the institutionalization of quotas for women's access to income opportunities, through which, in 2021, 654 women have accessed jobs in public transport and 4G infrastructure contracts; and implementing codes of conduct for eradication of sexual harassment in municipal and regional transport all over the country.

The **Fund for Forest Financing (FONAFIFO) in Costa Rica** has increased women's access to the Payment for Environmental Services loan program from 25% to 31% (2019–2021), through which women receive \$2.5 M to protect 3900 hectares of forests for the next 10 years.
