



The Netherlands' support is making a difference in people's lives through UNDP's global network, helping to achieve just transitions, leave no one behind, and support gender equality. Below are select activities in 2022.

Nige

Since 2022, the Penitentiary System Strengthening Programme (PRESPEN) is implementing prison reform to ensure that 40 Niger prisons comply with international standards for treating prisoners (Mandela Rules). With funding of € 20.2 million over 5 years, the programme offers extensive support for improving penitentiary services (detention conditions, prison services management, socio-economic reinsertion).

Mali

Over \$20 million has already been granted, and an additional \$6 million is under discussion for activities related to the fight against corruption. Significant results have been achieved thus far, with 509 conflict prevention mechanisms established, more than 120 conflicts resolved and a 12% increase in women's access to land.



Mozambique

UNDP is implementing the Stabilization Programme in the 6 most affected districts of Cabo Delgado to re-establish trust between the legitimate authorities and the community. 2,808 people (1,313 women have received livelihood opportunities through the Cash for Work initiative and a donation of 4,000kg of seeds and farming tools benefiting 4 000 households.


