Development Challenges

The South-West region of Cameroon faces a socio-political crisis that affects 2 million people. Essential infrastructure such as health care centres and water points have been destroyed and basic service delivery has been severely impacted.

Due to the reduced availability of essential services like proper healthcare and access to clean drinking water, the susceptibility of already marginalised groups has significantly increased. Apart from the direct destruction of healthcare facilities, some have faced vandalism and decay triggered by environmental elements such as floods. Urgent restoration of basic service delivery through the rehabilitation of health centres and water points is essential to counter the spread of illness and promote human security for affected populations.

The project builds on the success of the first phase of the project “Recovery in the South-West region of Cameroon through rehabilitation of health centres and water points,” which received funding from Japan to be implemented between Mar 2021 to Mar 2022. It also expands interventions beyond the Fako Division, the sole beneficiary of the first phase.

Project Objectives

The overall objective of the project is to enhance the resilience of populations in the crisis-affected South-West region of Cameroon and accelerate recovery through the rehabilitation of essential infrastructure to promote basic service delivery in the areas of Health, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH).

Project Outputs

The populations of the South-West Region have increased access to basic health care services.
