Development Challenges

Mozambique has been grappling with insurgency and violent attacks in parts of the gas-rich province of Cabo Delgado, with spillover effects in neighboring provinces such as Nampula and Niassa. Since 2017, violence perpetrated by Non-State Armed Groups (NSAGs) has displaced over 946,000 people and killed over 1,700 civilians. Thousands of houses were burnt to ground, public and private infrastructure/properties were destroyed, and thousands of families were forced to leave their villages. This evolving situation has provoked considerable developmental and governance challenges to the already very vulnerable province of Cabo Delgado

As the conflict becomes protracted, potential tensions between IDPs and host communities with increasing competition over already limited resources can hinder social cohesion. Despite the window of opportunity from the recent military gains, efforts to deliver assistance for stabilization, recovery and resilience need to be scaled up urgently. The volatile security and increasing attacks in Northern Mozambique are growing concerns that can lead to further violence with unprecedented effects to sustainable development in the country and across the borders.

Project Objectives

To re-establish the government's presence, restore basic services and livelihoods and contribute to protecting and

resuming economic development investments from public and private sectors in the Province of Cabo Delgado.

Project Outputs

Essential community infrastructure for basic services and housing is constructed or rehabilitated and are fully functional in Cabo Delgado Communities have access to emergency livelihoods support for food security and urgent economic recovery in Cabo Delgado
