FOOD & NUTRITION SECURITY BASED ON SUSTAINABLE LAND MANAGEMENT AND CLIMATE

UNDP jointly works with the Government of the State of Eritrea, FAO, and IFAD to strengthen the date palm sub-sector through the transfer of knowledge and technologies to Eritrean experts and farmers for enhanced propagation, production, harvest, and post-harvest management, and marketing of dates in the country.

Date palm is identified as a suitable crop in the Northern Red Sea, Southern Red Sea and Gash Barka regions with huge potential for improving the rural sector and contributing to the economic, social, and cultural aspects of the target population. It is expected to contribute towards increased opportunities for rural employment, improved food security and nutrition, and enhanced eco-restoration.

Moreover, date palms absorb carbon dioxide to a significantly greater extent than other trees due to their large size and contribute to emission reduction through enhanced carbon sink while contributing to the socio-economic situation of the target population.
