GOVERNANCE AND RULE OF LAW

Promoting inclusive access to justice in Yemen

The programme aims to strengthen the resilience of institutions and communities and to maintain a foundation for recovery and reconstruction.

STRENGTHENING INSTITUTIONAL AND ECONOMIC RESILIENCE IN YEMEN (SIERY)

The programme aims to mainstream gender through strengthening women's empowerment and inclusion at all stages in the institutional and economic resilience components of the project's implementation considering the social and cultural barriers women face in Yemen.



Schools have been rehabilitated in nine governorates.



Health centers in Al-Mudhaffar District, Taiz, rehabilitated.



Participated in an economic sector selection workshop.



Female local authority representatives (DFTs and DCTs) in 45 targeted districts enabled to respond inclusively to community needs.



Women governorate and district diwan staff and recent graduates capacitated on skills and local governance and public expenditure management (PEM) cycle.



Women were able to start their own business thanks to capacity development in value chain activities (henna, date, fish processing, and honey sectors), startup grants and partnerships with leading firms to market their products.






REBUILDING LIVELIHOODS AND CAPACITIES OF CONFLICT-AFFECTED SMALL-SCALE FISHERIES HOUSEHOLDS IN ADEN AND HADRAMOUT (RELACC)

Strengthens the resilience of Yemeni communities to cope with the effects of the current unrest and enables those whose livelihoods were severely disrupted to recover and rebuild their lives, particularly in fishing communities.



EMERGENCY SOCIAL PROTECTION ENHANCEMENT AND COVID-19 RESPONSE PROJECT (ESPECRP)

The Emergency Social Protection Enhancement and COVID-19 Response Project (ESPECRP) supports geographically bundled interventions of nutrition-sensitive cash transfers and temporary employment, while also improving access to sustainable livelihoods, key services, and economic opportunities for areas affected by hunger, malnutrition, and climate related shocks. The project is in line with the World Bank's integrated approach to improve food security resilience for Yemenis.


YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME 8



COVID-19 awareness sessions for 5.106 beneficiaries.


Supports improved WASH systems in five healthcare centers in Hadramout including water supply and handwashing services, the rehabilitation of sanitation systems and training, and systems development for medical waste management.



UN PEACE SUPPORT FACILITY (UN PSF)

Works with the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen and the UN Resident Coordinator by supporting Yemen's peace process. This involves implementing flexible initiatives that bring about tangible and lasting improvements in people's daily lives, while also building public support for the peace process.

Gender inclusion is an integral part of the UN PSF work. During 2022, PSF has been able to achieve the following:



After implementing the local forums, a report was developed to identify the key needs and priorities of women in the areas of protection, law enforcement, and community policing.

Two workshops on gender key concepts and gender analysis for Yemeni women-led organizations, CSOs, NGOs, and INGOs were conducted.




EMERGENCY MINE ACTION


Activities focus on reducing the risk of disaster and helping communities cope with the presence and negative effects of explosives. This is achieved through risk education, assistance to victims, explosive ordnance surveys, and clearance operations, which are carried out in cooperation with local demining authorities

ENHANCING RESILIENCE THROUGH SUSTAINABLE WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT


