REVIEW OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS' PERFORMANCE IN DISCLOSURE OF DISTRICT LAND USE PLANS AND PROVINCIAL LAND PRICING FRAMEWORKS ONLINE IN 2022

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Rationales for the 2nd review

Complaints, denunciations, petitions and reflections related to the land sector account for over 69.5%

(The thematic monitoring report "The implementation of the law on citizen reception and settlement of complaints and denunciations from July 1, 2016 to July 1, 2021")

- > Lack of transparency in land use planning and implementation of land use planning is one of the main reasons
- > Findings of the 1st review:
- Only 337/704 districts have disclosed the 2021 Land Use Plan on the website of the District People's Committee
- Only 27/63 provinces and centrally-run cities have disclosed the land pricing framework for the period 2020-2024 on the portal of their Provincial People's Committee

Review Objectives

Objective 1

To review citizen access to information on land pricing framework issued by provincial governments and 10-year land master plans and annual district-level land use plans for districts in all 63 provinces;

Objective 2

To develop a landing page to serve as a bridge to official portals on land use plans and land pricing framework issued by state agencies at all levels and publicize it in all 63 provinces;

Objective 3

To conduct empirical research on the requirements for land information provision in accordance with the Law on Access to Information 2016 and the Law on Land 2013;

Objective 4

To propose policy and action recommendations on improving access to land information.

Methodology

- ✓ Review legal documents on the disclosure of land information
- ✓ Review practices of disclosing 10-year land use master plans and annual land use plans at the district level and practices of disclosing land pricing frameworks at the provincial level on local governments' portals/websites
- ✓ Experiment requesting for land information by sending letters for information to district People's Committees to review local governments' responses to the requests
- ✓ Develop and update the land information portal at https://congkhaithongtindatdai.info/

Legal Basis for the Review

- Land Law 2013 (*Articles 37, 42, 45, 48, 114.1*)
- Law amending and supplementing a number of articles of 37 Laws related to planning in 2018 (Article 6)
- Decree No. 43/2014/ND-CP detailing the implementation of an article of the Land Law (Article 9.4)
- Decree No. 148/2020/ND-CP amending and supplementing a decree detailing the implementation of the Land Law (Article 1.5)
- Decree No. 44/2014/ND-CP regulating land prices (Article 12.5)
- Circular No. 01/2021/TT-BTNMT providing technical regulation on formulation and adjustment of land use planning (Article 50)
- Law on Access to Information 2016 (Article 17.1, Article 18, Article 23, 24, 25, Article 19.1.i)
- Decree No. 13/2018/ND-CP detailing the measures of implementing the Law on Access to Information









Some observations

- Documents on provincial land pricing framework and district land-use plans were usually issued more slowly than regulated
- Land-use plans were largely not fully disclosed, or disclosed in a scattered manner or posted in many sections/categories and lack consistency
- Using non-standard acronyms, compressed files, inefficient search functions;
 search engines do not return the needed results

> Some observations

- Many localities have software integrated with planning, but not displaying legal basis.
- Seals can be separated from text, zoomed out/zoomed in, or deleted
- The availability of a QR code that links to the public document directory
- 01 agency had 02 versions of portals/websites
- Users are required to log in to see the attached text or the text posted on Google Drive, but the access for the public is not granted
- Date of approval of the decision contradicts the date of disclosure and the date of issuance of the notice of public disclosure

Request information: District-level land use plan in 2022 Sampling design

 705 district units were divided into 5 random groups with 5 different sender roles. Letters from each group are further divided into two subgroups:

Letter of request according to Form 01a of Decree 13/2018/ND-CP,







06 responses of rejection

- Because the information has been made public according to regulations
- Due to insufficient basis for consideration
- Because the request for information had wrong purposes/did not meet requirements
- Because the request letter for information did not follow the sample/form regulated in Circular 34/2014/TT-BTNMT of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment
- The requirement that the request letter for information has to go with a letter of introduction
- No specific reasons; referral to the district Department of Natural Resources and Environment for further information

- 02 written rejections:
 - 01 response in the form of Notice of Rejection to provide information Form 05
 ND 13/2018/ND-CP
 - 01 response of rejection to providing answers
- 04 rejections via telephone

32 responses of other types

- Notice of referring the request to other agencies for follow-ups
- They responded that they would send the requested documents. However, no responses were received as of February 21, 2023.
- They had a general response that information has been disclosed at their office or on their portals
- They requested the information requester to come to attend a meeting to resolve the information request





> Some observations

- Most civil servants had a polite attitude, except for one who had an unfriendly attitude towards the researchers.
- The civil servant who sent the written response by mail (but the mail was returned) attempted to contact the requester via email to provide information
- Most agencies sent full documents instead of only sending a written approval decision of land-use plan in 2022.
- Some civil servants contacted and interacted with citizens through Zalo
- No requirements for any fees like in 2021 experiment. The civil servant explained about the cost in case the documents were scanned and sent to the requester in hard copies.
- Many civil servants did not use official e-mails to respond to citizens.

Good practices at the provincial level

Bac Giang and Phu Yen: 100% of their districts disclosed 2021-2030 land use master plans Ninh Thuan and Kon Tum: 100% of their districts disclosed 2022 annual land use plans Soc Trang, Quang Tri and Tra Vinh disclosed their provincial 2020-2024 land pricing frameworks on their provincial governments' portals on time Ba Ria-Vung Tau

Good practices at the district level

Tan Chau district (Tay Ninh province) satisfies all 5 criteria in disclosing 2021-2030 district-level land use master plan and 2022 district-level land use plan

Dien Ban district(Quang Nam province)
disclosed systematically
district-level annual land
use plans from 2015
until 2022

Tay Hoa district (Phu Yen province) attached a QR code in Disclosure Announcement that links to a folder of disclosed documents

Good practices at the district level

Yen The district (Bac Giang province) sent their notice of rejection to provide information but abided by the regulations on rejection as provided in the 2016 Law on Information Access.

Ba Be district (Bac Kan province),
Duc Co District (Gia Lai province),
Nghia Lo district (Yen Bai province), and
Krong No district (Dak Nong province)
using various ways to support and assure
information is provided to request sender



Recommendations (1)

- Include the procedure on information provision upon request as provided in the 2016 Law on Access to Information in administrative procedures of all sectors and fields (including land administration);
- Adding a regulation on the date a land use master plan must be approved by provincial authorities in laws and regulations on land administration to ensure the timeliness and synchronism in sequencing of land planning;
- Stipulate that land information holding agencies are responsible for providing information when requested by citizens;
- Retain the deadline for disclosing land information (within 15 days) as currently stipulated instead of within 30 days as put in the draft amended Land Law;
- Stipulate that land information disclosed on government portals be permanently maintained as Viet Nam is promoting government digitalization;
- Stipulate that the interfaces, sections and information disclosing approaches be developed systematically across all government web portals;

Recommendations (2)

- Continue to disseminate the Law on Access to Information 2016 to and provide training on the law implementation for public officials and civil servants as well as for citizens;
- Develop a section called 'Access to Information' on local government web portals;
- Arrange publicized information on government web portals by the order as stipulated in Article 19 of the 2016 Law on Access to Information to facilitate citizen access anywhere, anytime;
- Add audio and visual search facilities on government portals/websites to ensure that the search function is friendly for all users, including ethnic minorities and people with disability.
