
RESPONDENTS' PERCEPTIONS OF THE AVAILABILITY OF REHABILITATION SERVICES IN DIFFERENT TYPES OF RESIDENTIAL SETTLEMENTS

The perception of the availability of rehabilitation services significantly depends on the type of the residential settlement




In villages, only **15**% believe that all/the majority of rehabilitation services are available, while in small towns, the figure is **9**%.

51% in villages and **27%** in small towns report being aware of cases where such services are entirely absent

OVERVIEW OF NATIONWIDE SURVEY RESULTS
OCTOBER 2023

Sample Size: 2014 respondents

Respondent Characteristics: individuals aged 18 and above, residing in the territory controlled by Ukraine, representing all oblasts of Ukraine as of February 24, 2022, except for those temporarily occupied in 2014-2015.

Sample Composition: The distribution of respondents in the sample by macro-region of residence, type of residential settlement, gender, and age was benchmarked against official statistical sources. The statistical margin of error for the sample (with a 95% confidence level and a design effect of 1.1) does not exceed 2.4%.

Survey Method: CATI (Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews)

Dates: September 29 - October 9, 2023

The survey was conducted by the Kyiv International Institute of Sociology

The nationwide survey was conducted by the Kyiv International Institute of Sociology with the support of the United Nations Development Programme in Ukraine within the project "Supporting the rehabilitation of people with disabilities caused by the war" with the financial support of the governments of the Republic of Korea and Germany.

EXPERIENCE OF INJURIES AND HEALTH IMPAIRMENTS DUE TO WAR



- **31%** espondents (every third participant) reported that either they personally or their family members/friends have experienced injuries, health impairments, or illnesses since February 24, 2022.
- of them, 6% had personal experience



- among internally displaced people, a total of **40**% had such experience.
- **14**% had personal experience.





REHABILITATION SERVICES MOST NEEDED BY RESPONDENTS



73% indicated a need for rehabilitation services



BARRIERS TO ACCESS TO REHABILITATION SERVICES

	lack of financial resources	46%
	absence of qualified professionals in the place of residence	32%
?	uncertainty about where to go and who to contact for assistance	31%
	lack of necessary documents or difficulties in obtaining them	30%
Q	absence of nearby rehabilitation centers or facilities	28%



17% of respondents reported a need, but are not receiving any rehabilitation services

Among internally displaced people, 41% report that they don't know where to seek assistance (compared to 29% among non-IDPs)
