

## Next steps



**Strengthen emergency medical services** by providing **18 specialized vehicles** and **10 vehicles** for primary health care, conducting training for **200 ambulance drivers** and facilitating **12 Basic Life Support training sessions** for medical staff



**Improve psychological and palliative care** by establishing a **Public Health and Recovery Centre**, forming six mobile palliative care teams, creating **10 psychological relief spaces**, and organizing a **seasonal training school** for young health care specialists



**Promote transparency and anti-corruption efforts** by creating a **Model Communication Strategy**, establishing **working groups** on transparency and accountability and procurement policy, and organizing an **Anti-Corruption Camp** for **30 law students**



**Implement technology and digitalization in public services** by installing the **“Electronic case manager”** system, procuring tools for the Electronic Document Management System, and **developing websites** for Donetsk and Luhansk oblast administrations



**Support the renovation of four public infrastructure facilities to improve local service provision**, conduct training for social service providers and supply specialized vehicles for **18 social adaptation centres**



**Enhance access to essential administrative services** through the reconstruction and equipping of **7 administrative service centres** and the procurement of **12 mobile service delivery vehicles**

## Increasing access to quality public services

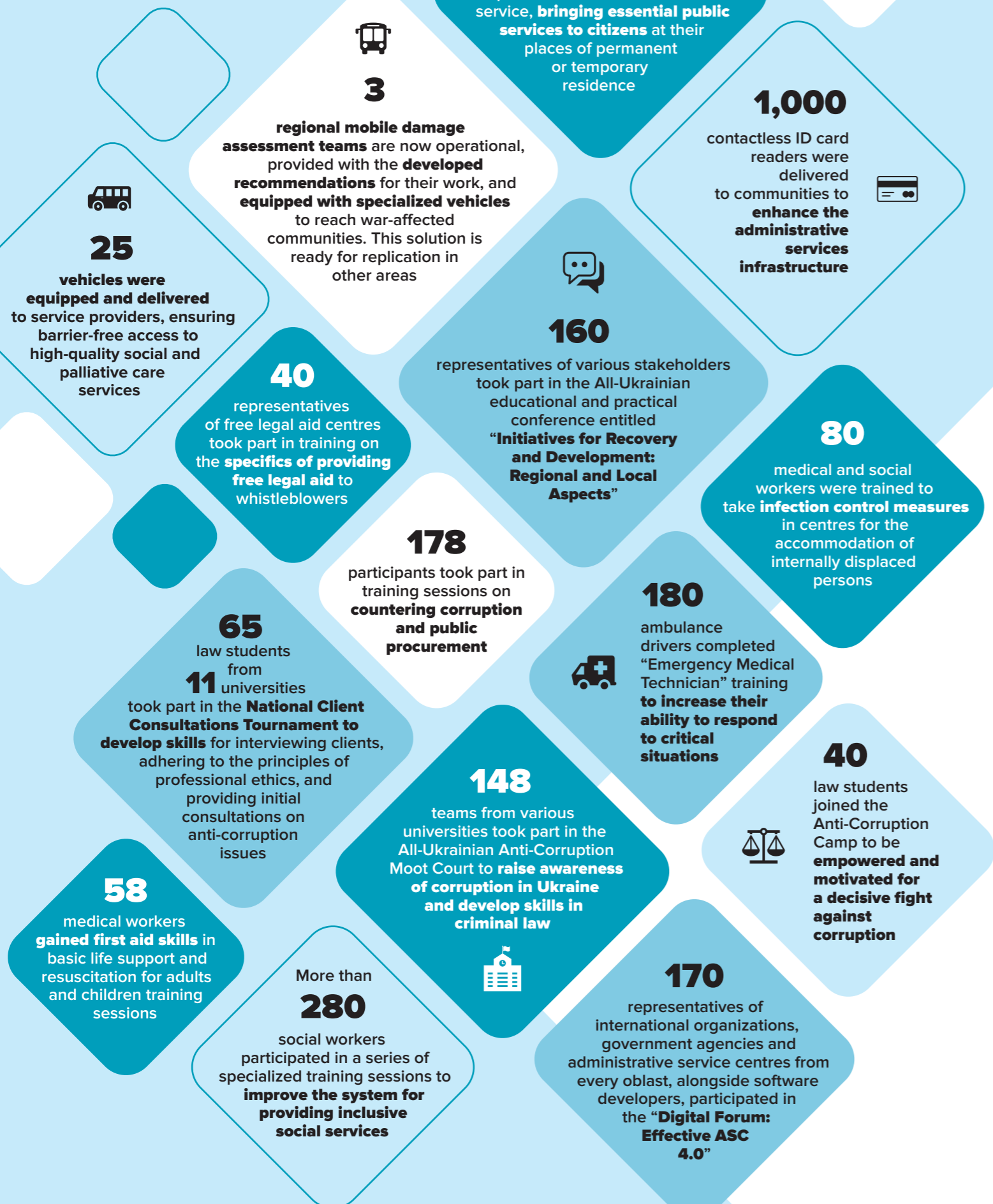
