

# TriPartite Partnership to Support National Human Rights Institutions (TPP)



The TPP aims to increase fulfilment of human rights for all people by providing a unique platform of collaboration for the United Nations to support national human rights institutions (NHRIs) around the world.

The TPP was established by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and the Global Alliance of National Human Rights Institutions (GANHRI) in 2011 to harness the collective strengths and comparative advantages of each partner in support of NHRIs. The TPP began programming in the African region in 2018 and expanded support to reach NHRIs across all regions in 2022 through UNDP's *Global Programme for Strengthening the Rule of Law, Human Rights, Justice, and Security for Sustainable Peace and Development (the Global Programme on the Rule of Law and Human Rights)*.

## PHASE I (2018-2021)

- **5 countries** supported to strengthen, assess, and establish NHRIs through TPP programming
- **5 NHRIs** supported through the international accreditation process
- **17 NHRIs** supported as human rights defenders and to protect civic space alongside the development of **key resources**
- **Global study and regional needs assessment** of NHRIs conducted in the context of COVID-19

## PHASE II (2022-2024)

- **13 NHRIs** receiving TPP programmatic support to build and assess their capacities
- **Practical tools** for NHRIs on digitalization and climate-change under development
- **Support the voice of NHRIs** in key policy forums on human rights and development

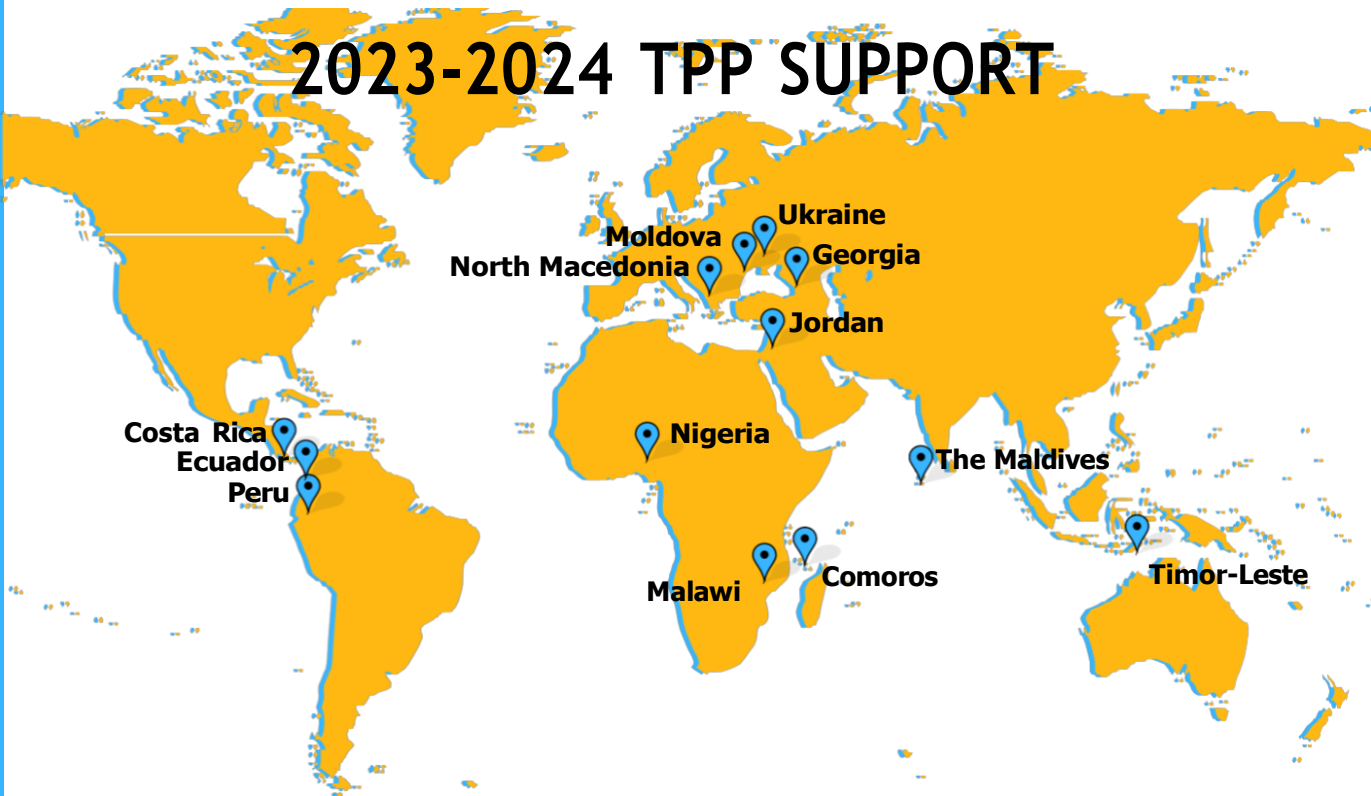
