It utilizes UNDP's unique ability to bridge economic, social, and environmental objectives. The Country Programme offers a blend of technical, policy, and implementation support, focusing on policy dialogues with the government, knowledge exchange, and capacity building. It emphasizes national ownership and leadership to ensure sustainable outcomes.



launched 7 Sustainable Development Goal Coordination Centres (SDGCCs) to help integrate the Sustainable Development Goals' into sub national action plans, policies, budgets, and programmes aiming to address social and spatial gaps.

UNDP, as the G20 Sustainable Finance Working Group (SFWG) Secretariat, supported adoption of New Delhi Leaders' Declaration deliverables in three

priority areas, (a) Mechanisms for timely and adequate Resources for Climate Finance (b) Enabling Finance for the SDGs (c) Capacity Building of the ecosystem for financing towards sustainable development, and proposed the G20 Technical Assistance Action Plan (TAAP) for capacity building.

Sustainable management of natural resources: biodiversity and ecosystem restoration, creation of carbon sinks, promotion of green enterprises and nature-based livelihoods. implementing One Health approach.



Phase-out of hazardous chemicals: environmentally sound management of ozone depleting substances (ODS), Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs), Unintentional Persistent Organic Pollutants (U-POPs). toxic chemicals like mercury and e-waste.



Circular economy: promoting comprehensive management of dry waste including plastic.



Buildina resilience of communities to natural disasters and climate change: developing early warning systems, disaster preparedness, and climate adaptation.








Financial Outlay (2023-2027) in Million
