



Fostering Reforestation Environmental Sustainability and Tourism in the Okyeman

Launch and Activation of Leopard Clubs in Schools.

Summary: The Okyeman Environment Foundation, in partnership with the Ghana Education Service (GES), have launched leopard clubs in basic schools in nine (9) districts of Okyeman to empower the next generation of environmental stewards.

Background/ Context

The Leopard Clubs is to establish a more sustainable medium of creating awareness on environmental issues with basic school going children in the communities. It is identified that children in primary and Junior High Schools would have a more participatory role in environmental conservation and remain active agents for a

longer period than adults. Through the re-introduction of Leopard Clubs, which was originally established by the Okyeman Environment Foundation in collaboration with the Ghana Education Service, pupils would be engaged in activity-based learning and community action towards environmental health, conservation and climate innovation.
