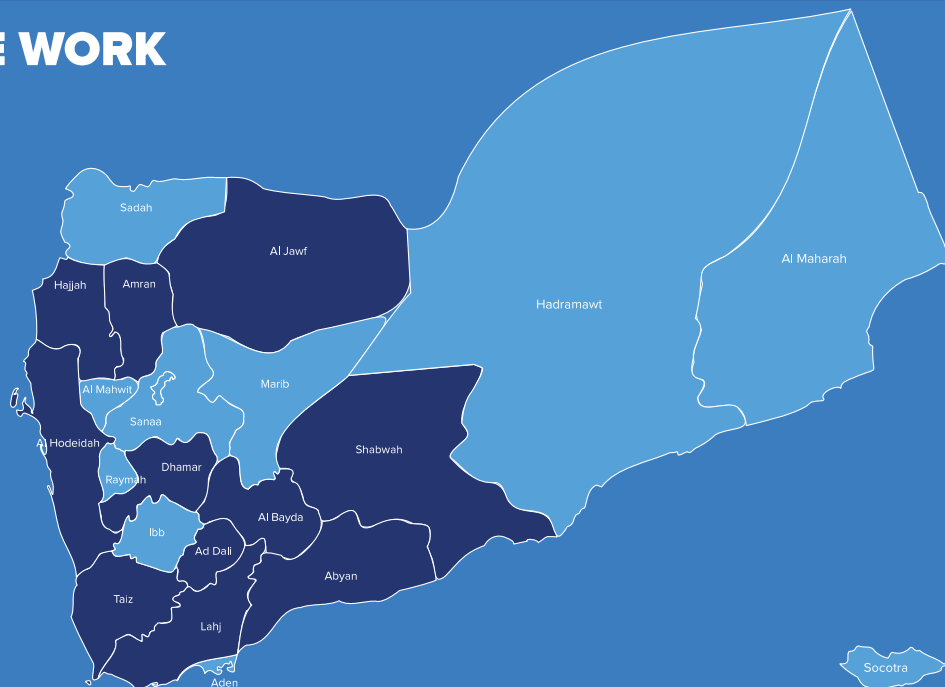

20,619 households with improved food security (**30%** expected to be female-headed)



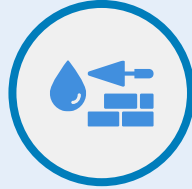
3,827 farmers with improved access to water resources (**947** women)

Supporting climate resilient agriculture in Yemen

In the district of Wesab AsSafil, Dhamar Governorate, the damage of Kubbat Al-Ashraf irrigation canal left many farmers, struggling to irrigate their fields, leading to decreased agricultural productivity and forcing some to abandon their lands.

To address these issues, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) partnered with the Social Fund for Development (SFD) and the Public Works Project (PWP) to implement the Food Security Response and Resilience Project (FSRRP) interventions and rehabilitate the canal to restore water access benefiting around 4,500 agricultural households thereby enhancing food security and economic stability in the region.
