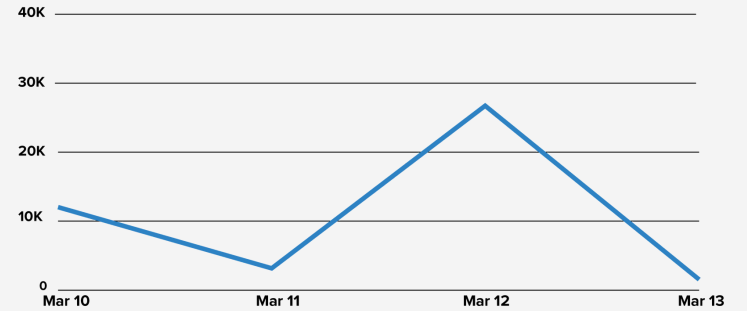
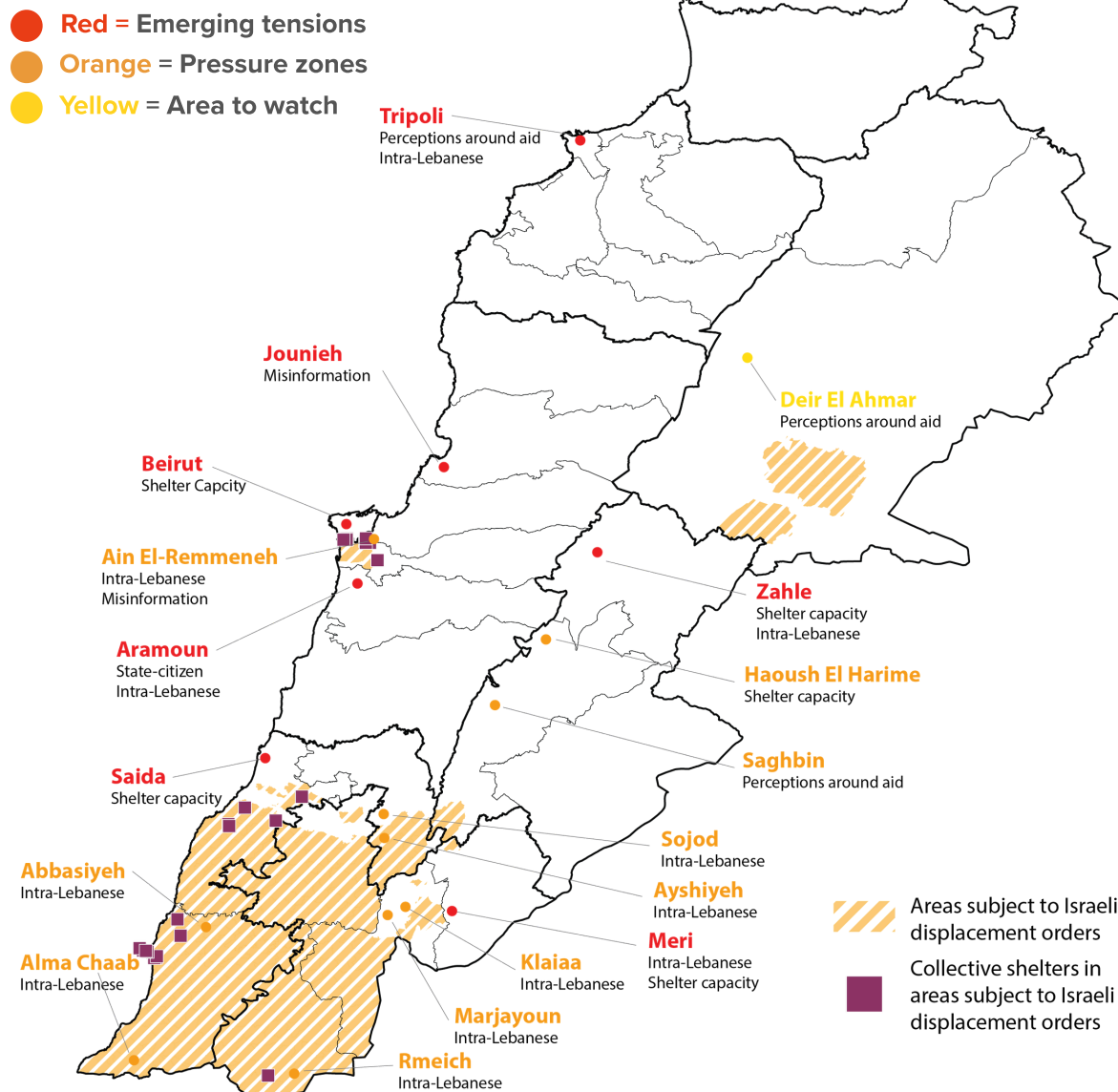


Figure 1: Engagement trend around anti-IDP rhetoric following attacks of “safe areas”

- **Debate** around the President of the Republic’s four-point initiative to end the conflict.
- **Public shaming** of individuals accused of theft or collaboration continues to circulate.
- **Anti-IDP rhetoric** increasing following continued military strikes affecting “safe areas”
- **Strike on Lebanese University** and reported killing of two professors largely condemned.
- **Growing expressions of solidarity** with Syrians from certain communities with limited shelter options.

KEY SIGNALS from last 48 hours

- **Additional evacuation warnings targeting IDPs** reported in Marjayoun, Aichiye & Sojod.
- **Community calls** for the relocation of IDPs reported in Aramoun and Meri.
- **Growing calls for relocation** of IDPs from predominantly Christian villages in the South.
- **Entrenched political polarization** increasingly shaping intra-Lebanese dynamics & influencing host–IDP relations & information environment.
- **South: Displacement orders** expanding geographically up to the Zahrani River.
- **Expansion** of targeted zones in Beirut.
- **Localized tensions linked to perceptions around food assistance** reported in West Bekaa, with an incident during distribution in Tripoli on 11 March.
- **Reopening of schools in “safe” areas** generating contestation among IDP population and framed in some narratives as discriminatory.
- **Increased number of incidents of disputes in collective shelters** in Beirut and Bekaa.

WHAT TO WATCH



- **Growing pressure to restrict hosting of IDPs**
- **Heightened political debate** around proposals for direct negotiations with Israel
- **Inter-communal sensitivities** linked to perceived unequal access to shelter and assistance for some Syrian communities
- **Incidents of tension** linked to the photographing of IDPs without consent
- **Heightened concern** over the potential expansion of strikes affecting civilian infrastructure
