

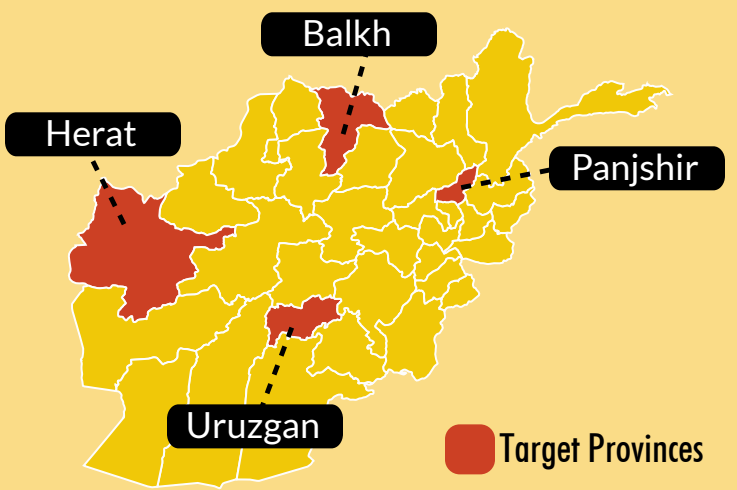

Adaptation in Afghanistan

Funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF), supported by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and implemented by Afghanistan's Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock (MAIL), the Climate Change Adaptation Project (CCAP) has achieved impressive results in just five years (2014-2019).
