Strengthening of EIFORCES Training and Operational Capacities in Cameroon

Objectives

The Project's main objective is to provide specific training courses for civilian, Police and Military Personnel by Japan International subject matter experts to advance EIFORCES bid to become an UN accredited peacekeeping training Centre of Excellence and to build a 32-beds dormitory at the EIFORCES Campus in AWAE to increase the capacity of the school to accommodate trainees. The increasing demand in peacekeeping forces makes it necessary.

Project Outputs

Output 1: 33 personnel of security forces of the subregion are trained in CPTM and in PSO by Japan International subject matter experts.

Output 2: 32-beds dormitory to increase the accommodation of EIFORCES trainees is built. 08 months.

Development Challenges

Cameroon remains the main stabilizing country in the Central African subregion. However, the country's stability itself has now come under serious jeopardy, due to numerous internal and regional factors that have evolved from potential to manifested or aggravated threats.

Despite significant successes, efforts to reduce the Islamist terrorism of Boko Haram in the northern part of the country are still ongoing, with occasional setbacks.

While Cameroon needs to deploy more Defence and Security personnel to keep such threats in check, its eastern border suffers attacks from roque armed groups from the Central African Republic (CAR). Cameroon must thus simultaneously help train CAR Security Forces, a task in which the country is significantly involved and should be supported for both strategic and humanitarian reasons. This is ongoing with Japan support through EIFORCES for all regular trainings for the rehabilitation and the restructuration of the CAR through its security apparatus.
