Youth Connekt Africa

YouthConnekt Sahel is an initiative of the YouthConnekt Africa Hub in partnership with the UNDP Sub-Regional Hub for West and Central Africa, which is the pan-African platform with the vision of connecting African youth for socio-economic transformation. Headquartered in Rwanda, the YCA Hub has since 2017 prioritized the empowerment and full participation of youth in the achievement of Africa's SDGs mandate, the AU 2063 agenda, and AU Youth Charter.

Working in tandem with sub-regional and national initiatives to accelerate results at scale and with impact, the YCA Hub accomplishes its mandate by:

1

Coordinating a global network to create a continental ecosystem for African youth;

2

Sharing experience and knowledge on program and policy design, youth initiatives, fund setting and reporting;

3

Providing a conduit for resources at scale and data on youth to up-skill and finance African youth-led enterprises.



Since the launch of YouthConnekt Africa, several African countries have demonstrated strong interest in learning and replicating the model in their respective countries. As a result, YouthConnekt has scaled up beyond Rwanda to 23 African countries and providing critical support to youth, promoting innovative and promising practices, and scaling-up key local solutions as integrated youth empowerment models. This is being done not only empower youth including the most vulnerable, but also contribute towards local and national development.

The YouthConnekt Sahel Forum is an extension of this Africa-wide agenda and effort. In addition, it will provide a platform to enable Sahelian youth exchange innovative ideas, explore their potential to the fullest, brainstorm on opportunities and home-grown solutions to achieving peace, prosperity and resilience. The overarching goal if this important platform is to inspire, connect, engage and empower young people in the region, to change the Sahel narrative into a land of opportunities, investment and prosperity. This platform will also allow young people, particularly the most vulnerable, to move beyond the challenges and discover the potential in them and the opportunities offered by the Sahel region.

Following the UN-Generation Unlimited Sahel (GenU Sahel) launch by the UN Deputy Secretary-General on the 1 November 2021, YCA is collaborating with GenU Sahel and other partners to launch the Sahel YouthConnekt Hub. GenU Sahel's operational framework focuses on building a ready workforce in the sub-region. It calls for an urgent, collective, and robust political leadership in Sahel countries. GenU works in new ways to align, amplify, and multiply efforts of the public, private and multilateral sectors with and for youth in an innovative partnership paradigm with a view to mobilizing catalytic funding to accelerate action in the most vulnerable Sahel populations with a focus on young women.

The Youth Connekt Sahel Forum (YCSF)

The Sahel is a youthful region with unique social, political, and geographical standing in Africa. The youth is the biggest asset of the region, if it is valued and utilized properly it will lead to peace, prosperity and stability in the region.

The YouthConnekt Sahel Forum (YCSF) 2021 will be an annual convening event that connects youth from across the Sahel region (Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, The Gambia, Guinea, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Nigeria, and Senegal) and beyond with policy influencers, political leaders, and public, private and development sector institutions as well as the civil society to engage, discuss, design and accelerate youth empowerment efforts in the region. The YCSF intends to create a platform for Sahelian youth to voice their issues, promote local solutions and rebrand the region beyond fragility, crisis and violence. Moreover, YCSF will enable the youth to set the vision for the region and lead the change process for the transformation of the region through local solutions, innovations, disruptions and with positive engagement. This year's forum will focus on "Connecting Sahelian Youth for Peace and Prosperity" and will be discussing various aspects of youth empowerment - economic, social, digital, and political empowerment of young Sahelians. The YCSF 2021 is a testament of the flagship collaboration between the UN and GenU Sahel under the auspices of the UN Special Coordinator for Development in the Sahel and signifies UNDP's contribution to the UNISS and its Support Plan tenets to empower youth.

Held in Dakar, the capital city of Senegal, the YouthConnekt Sahel Forum will offer, over three days, a combination of informative, high-level plenaries, panel discussions, keynote speeches, small group workshops, awards, learning visits, exhibition and cultural events.

The YCSF 2021 is organized in line with the ongoing flagship collaboration between the UN and Generation Unlimited (GenU) under the auspices of the UN Special Coordinator for Development in the Sahel. YC Sahel and the Forum is UNDP contribution and articulation of youth programmes to the UNISS and its Support Plan tenets to empower youth.

Event Format

The YouthConnekt Sahel Forum (YCSF'21) will take place in Dakar, Senegal from 30th November to 3rd December 2021, at King Fahd Palace Hotel. Over three (3) days, YCSF will deliver a combination of informative, high-level plenaries, panel discussions, keynote speeches, small group workshops, awards, learning visits, exhibition and cultural events.

The YCSF 2021 will be organized in a hybrid mode targeting 500 in-person delegates and at least 2,500 participating virtually from across the Sahel and beyond with a specific effort to ensure participation of young women and youth with disabilities. The virtual participation will be unlimitedly open to interested youth and partners. Physical presence will strictly adhere to the COVID-19 preventive measures. The Forum will feature an opening ceremony to launch the YouthConnekt Sahel Initiative & YouthConnekt Senegal chapter followed by plenary, parallel sessions and interspersed with a cross border trade show and exhibition.

Youth Greening the Sahel – Accelerating Green Innovations and Actions towards Greener Sahel

Greening the Sahel is the only way to food security, vegetation and sustainable livelihoods for communities living in the region. According to FAO reports around 10 million hectares will need to be restored each year to reverse the impacts of deforestation, overgrazing and desertification of the Sahel. In simple words, some 166 million hectares of land have been identified for restoration in the survey — nearly three times the size of Kenya or France. This is a massive job that requires integrated community-based efforts that use innovations and indigenous knowledge together to lead the regreening process. Since, youth is the biggest segment of the population, it would be integral to engage, train and support young Sahelians to lead this green revolution to build a greener future for them and generations to come. This session will bring informed discussion on nature-based ecosystems, agroforestry businesses, green construction, effective land management, green innovations to protect the environment and create decent green jobs.


