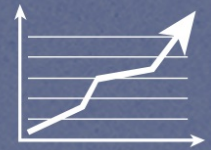
I. PROVIDE VOCATIONAL TRAINING

UNDP helped train 985 youth in 2015 and 800 youth in 2016 and plans to train over 10,000 youth



II. PROMOTE BUSINESS

UNDP will help assess obstacles to business creation and organize South-South exchanges to identify reform pathways



III. ENSURE BETTER MIGRATION GOVERNANCE

UNDP will provide support to develop the legislative, policy, and institutional infrastructure for managing safer migration in line with the SDGs and in support of Eritrea's participation in international and regional dialogue processes

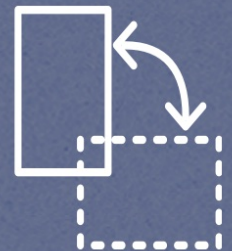
IV. WORK WITH ERITREA'S DIASPORA
