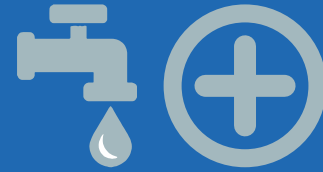


Recovery in South-West region of Cameroon through rehabilitation of health centres and water points

OBJECTIVES

The proposed project will aim to upgrade infrastructure to facilitate reviving public service delivery, such as the rehabilitation of primary health care centres and rehabilitation of water points.

PROJECT OUTPUTS

Output 1: The populations of the Fako Division in the South-West region have increased access to basic health care services.

Output 2: The populations of the Fako Division in the South-West region have increased access to safe drinking water.

DEVELOPMENT CHALLENGES

Cameroon has experienced an armed conflict in the North-West and South-West regions since 2017. This conflict has caused a huge death toll in both civilian and combatant populations, significant economic decline, growing underdevelopment, and a breakdown in social cohesion.

The Government has called for action in close collaboration with UNDP and in consultation with other UN Agencies, international NGOs, civil society, and the private sector. To this end, UNDP formulated a Recovery Program, within the framework of the PPRD, which aims to tie short-term rehabilitation and humanitarian measures with longer-term reconstruction and development interventions.

Immediate priority will be given to repairing water networks, repairing schools and hospitals, and providing the appropriate conditions to return to normal life.

This will complement and reinforce current humanitarian efforts by supporting the transition towards civilian-led recovery and ultimately the return to normalcy for the Anglophone regions.
