BRIEF ANALYSIS LABOUR MARKET **THIRD QUARTER 2020**




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This brief is dedicated to the results of the recently published Labour Force Survey results by INSTAT and administrative data on third guarter 2020, to better understand the effects of social distancing policies as a response to the COVID-19 outbreak, on the labour market. The analysis, described through infographics, captures the changes on the main labour market indicators, making a comparison to the last quarter (Q2-2020) and the last year (Q3-2019).

Methodological Note

Labour Force Survey, in response to the situation created and to assure the collection of the information needed for the estimation of the employment indicators, is implemented through telephone interviews for the reference period 9 - 29 Mars 2020. Telephone interviews were not possible to be realized for new households in the sample. For the existing households in the sample, not all interviews were possible as well. Next update: 10 March
