Overview of LNB support

Our interventions contribute to advance social inclusion in Albania by providing better social services across the country. We have currently prioritized 24 municipalities across Albania: Berat, Bulqizë, Dibër, Durrës, Fier, Fushë-Krujë, Korçë, Lezhë, Lushnje, Përmet, Pogradec, Prrenjas, Sarandë, Shijak, Shkodër, Tiranë, Ura Vajqurore, Elbasan, Gramsh, Malig, Mallakastër, Malësi e Madhe, Librazhd and Vlora.

Provide capacity building for vulnerable groups and their representative organizations on rights and inclusion.

Support municipalities to **deliver** community - based integrated social services.

Support development of local social care plans and their implementation.

Build the capacities and skills of municipal social services units and service providers to plan, budget, deliver and monitor social care services.

Support policy development and legislation in the area of social inclusion.

Support Social Impact Assessment at local level to inform municipal investment and social service provision.

Support INSTAT in carrying out longitudinal analysis of all SILC-compliant data.

Establish the methodology for **assessing** and mapping the social care services in 61 municipalities

Support Ministry of Health and Social Protection in establishing standards, protocols and monitoring methodology of social care service provision.

'Leave No One Behind' (LNB) Programme aims to improve the social services system in Albania by increasing participation of vulnerable groups in public decision-making that affect their lives. Our support contributes to the holistic vision of an inclusive Albania working to meet Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and European Union integration.

Progress

At LNB, we work to empower all vulnerable communities with a focus on persons with disabilities, Roma and Egyptians, to request and access social services, as a human right and entitlement. We do this through organization of advocacy, public awareness and information sharing events.

Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) services is established

in **11 REGIONS** and 68 health education teams have been set-up to increase demand for SRH services for young persons in need.

NETWORKS AND FORUMS OF ACTIVISTS IN

MUNICIPALITIES (Local Social Dialogue Groups, Forums of Persons with Disabilities, Youth Voice Network, and Young Reporters in the Field) are established to ensure dialogue between local stakeholders to address issues of vulnerable groups in local plans and budgets.

At local level, we work to enable municipalities to effectively manage the provision of rights-based social services and promote social inclusion.

11 MUNICIPALITIES have developed social care plans through participatory processes.

839 PROFESSIONAL STAFF

from 16 municipalities have better knowledge and skills on planning and implementation of the new social care legislation and policy, and social services provision.

600 TEACHERS, SCHOOL HEAD MASTERS, AND PSYCHOLOGISTS from

30 schools in 7 municipalities are trained on inclusive education.





1,483 WOMEN engaged in the participatory practices for gender responsive budgeting in 3 municipalities.

NB completed its second year of support to Government of Albania, and concrete results are achieved at several levels: • at community level: vulnerable groups are empowered on their rights and entitlements to social services, and are mobilized for a meaningful participation in advocacy forums and public consultation mechanisms;

• at local government level: municipalities (16) have developed and costed social care plans tailored to vulnerable

• at policy level: Social Enterprises Fund and Social Care Fund are operational, and resourced from public funding. Ministry of Health and Social Protection and Ministry of Education, Sports and Youth are supported in reviewing their existing policy frameworks and action plans to better align them with the EU accession agenda.
