## TWO YEARS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NATIONAL ACTION PLAN

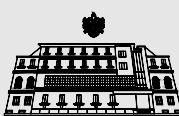


The National Action Plan for the Integration of Roma and Egyptians (NAPIRE) 2016-2020, is a document of the Albanian Government that includes specific policies aiming to improve the life of Roma and Egyptians. NAPIRE is based on principles antidiscrimination as well as the Albanian legal framework. This Fact Sheet is prepared by the Ministry of Health and Social Protection in Albania with the support of the "Economic and Social Empowerment for Roma and Egyptians – a booster for social inclusion" (ESERE) project, funded by the European Union and implemented by United Nations Development Programme.
