

Programme at a Glance



"Leave No One Behind" (LNB) is a Joint United Nations Programme funded by the Swiss Development Cooperation (SDC). The Programme launched in June 2017 aims to empower the vulnerable persons in Albania to have:

- 1 Equal access to public services and opportunities
- 2 A voice in public decision-making affecting their lives
- To hold the duty bearers accountable

The Programme makes use of technical expertise and know-how of UN agencies in the country which allow for greater impact and outreach by focusing on the municipal level and its linkage to the national level. The programme is implemented by four UN partner agencies: UNDP, UNFPA, UNICEF, and UN WOMEN.

Programme Pillars

- Enhance organizational capacities of social care agencies at local level to provide better quality, more inclusive, equitable and efficient services
- Support national institutions in better implementing their social inclusion policies and adequately funding social services through improved data collection systems and organizational capacities
- Support the national and local government authorities as well as NGOs to uphold the principles of gender equality and good governance in their planning, implementation and policy formulation
- Generate knowledge about and promote good practices and mechanisms of social inclusion, social care and social protection in Albania

Leave No One Behind programme interventions cover the whole country, by contributing to improve social service provision across all local government units. The Programme's current interventions extend to 15 municipalities: Shkoder, Kukes, Lezhe, Diber, Fushe-Kruje, Durres, Tirane, Lushnje, Prrenjas, Pogradec, Korce, Ura Vajgurore, Berat, Fier, and Permet.



What do we want to achieve?

- Empower persons with disabilities, Roma and Egyptians and vulnerable women, to request and have access to social services as a pre-condition to improve their lives.
- Enable Municipalities to effectively manage the provision of rights-based social services and promote social inclusion.
- Strengthen capacities of national institutions to implement their policy framework to fund and provide social services.
