

3RP 2018 AT A GLANCE

The conflict in Syria still continues to drive the largest refugee crisis in the world – there are over 5 million Syrian refugees registered in a region already filled with economic and social challenges.

Despite the generosity of host countries, refugees are increasingly vulnerable with each passing year of displacement, with the vast majority of families living below the poverty line, and over 40 per cent of Syrian refugee children out-of-school.

While the search for a political solution continues, it is vital that we continue our support to Syrian refugees, and vulnerable host communities, to help them meet their basic needs and avoid resorting to negative choices, such as forced child labor and early marriage.

**The 3RP seeks USD 4.4 billion in 2018 to assist over 9 million people (5.3 million refugees and 3.9 million host community members) to address immediate needs, while also boosting livelihoods, infrastructure, public services and community development.**

3RP Partners are pioneers in strengthening the link between humanitarian and development interventions that meet immediate humanitarian needs, while boosting livelihoods, expanding access to critical infrastructure and fostering community development in the longer term. The international community should further support this coherent approach.

The 2018 3RP continues to build on the shared vision among stakeholders to further integrate humanitarian assistance, resilience and development into a nationally owned, but regionally coherent plan that aims to enhance national capacities.

Donors are urged to give generously in 2018, as 3RP programming has made a tangible difference in people's lives. This progress needs to continue and be sustained in the longer-term to meet the growing needs of Syrian refugees and vulnerable members of host communities.



RRP/3RP 2012-2017 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS



Operational Achievements

Since 2012, the RRP/3RP response has provided protection and assistance to over 5 million Syrian refugees and millions more host community members, as well as support to the national systems and services that support them in host communities. This host community support is vital in a context where more than 90 per cent of the refugee caseload lives in urban, peri-urban or rural areas, rather than camps. Some of the RRP/3RP achievements since 2012 are outlined below.

**164,706** Syrians submitted for resettlement

**94 per cent** of Syrian refugees now have updated registration records including iris scan enrolment

Over **784,000** children have received specialized child protection services



**4,421** classrooms constructed, established or rehabilitated

**223,461** individuals supported to access employment (trainings, internships, job placement and language courses)

At least **2.7 million** individuals have benefited from improved access to adequate quantity of safe water and **1.5 million** individuals benefited from access to adequate latrines

At least **1.2 million** individuals benefited from shelter solutions

**13.7 million** consultations in primary health care services and **1,514** health facilities supported
