Objectives

- Launch the reports on *Gender Justice & the Law: Assessment of laws affecting gender equality in the Arab States region* in 18 countries.
- Encourage media interest in the findings of the country studies and promote them as a baseline for measurement of progress on gender equality within the 2030 Agenda
- Explore with champions and legal advocates to identify most relevant issues for which the momentum is ripe to promote change in laws and mindsets in region

Background

In the Arab states region, multiple sources of law, the persistence of customary practices, the lack of coordination of the judicial and security sectors to effectively deliver justice, as well as economic, cultural and socio-political factors act as serious impediments for women to access justice, hindering the achievement of gender equality and therefore the Sustainable Development Goals, especially goals 5, 10 and 16. ²

Sexual and Gender Based Violence (SGBV) including domestic violence, rape and other forms of sexual assault, sexual harassment, child and forced marriage, female genital mutilation/cutting (FGM/C), trafficking in persons, sexual slavery and so-called honour-based crimes are prevalent in the region.

Furthermore, gender norms centred around preserving family honour perpetuate impunity towards perpetrators of violence. This is manifested through discriminatory laws that provide inadequate protection of women (for example: in several countries in the region, the penal code exonerates a rapist from punishment if he marries his victim and honour crimes allow for mitigating circumstances to reduce their criminal sentence), and even when such rights and protection are recognized in the law, their inconsistent enforcement or implementation reinforced by patriarchal norms that view women and girls in a subordinate role often impede access to justice, and obstruct women's empowerment.

To support identifying the legal measures that prevent GBV and to encourage policy and institutional reforms that bring down structural barriers to women's empowerment, UNDP worked together with UN Women,

UNFPA in 18 countries in the Arab region, and the 3 agencies collaborated with ESCWA at regional level to produce a regional report on *Gender Justice and the Law in the Arab Region – What will it take to achieve the SDGs?*

Each country report highlights the main legal barriers preventing women's access to justice and legal protection from GBV in the Arab States. Furthermore, country level findings are summarized in a 2 pager to highlight the deficits between national laws and international standards and the steps that will be needed to achieve many of the targets agreed upon in the Sustainable Development Goals.

Objectives of the Consultative Dialogue and accompanying workshop

The objectives of the Dialogue are to widely share and disseminate the country findings with key government representatives; judges, prosecutors and lawyers; parliamentarians; women's machineries, women and youth rights activists from the Arab region and beyond.

The discussions organized during the launch event (day 1) and subsequent technical workshop (day 2) will provide an opportunity to highlight the key challenges in the region to eliminate gender discrimination in the law and ensure women's access to justice and their legal protection.

In particular, the dialogue and workshop will aim to:

- A) Highlight the status of gender justice and the law in the region, and stress that law reform will constitute a key driver for achieving SDGs across the Arab region;
- B) Facilitate the ownership by national governments and encourage their commitments to introduce potential future reform in the penal codes, family law, nationality law and labor laws;
- C) Create media interest in the topic to support future advocacy for law changes and reforms;
- D) Identify potential regional and national evidence based advocacy initiatives to improve gender justice in the region;
- E) Leverage strategic regional partnerships on gender justice with regional structures;
- F) Raise awareness of the <u>online legal database</u> (e-platform) launched by UNDP, UN Women, and CAWTAR in 2016. It includes more than 3600 laws, as well as legal profiles from 20 Arab Countries, all of which are searchable through an online portal.
