# Methodology used in the Rural Household Survey 

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## 1 Introduction

Prism Research - a market, media and social research agency - for the purpose of examination of rural development in Bosnia and Herzegovina (B\&H) within NHDR 2012 report, conducted a quantitative survey research by gathering data about various topics linked with rural life in rural areas of B\&H.
The objective of this survey research was to collect information on demographic data, employment data, access to services, income and poverty, access to resources, access to capital, experiences and status regarding labour market, outputs they produce, access to markets, as well as access to information and training, when it comes to inhabitants of the rural areas in B\&H.

The research was conducted through field questionnaires, in the period of 31st March until 22nd April, 2012. Representative sample of $\mathrm{N}=3055$ respondents from rural areas of B\&H, were interviewed, using CAPI method (Computer Aided Personal Interviewing). In this research, respondents were mainly heads of the households, or other appropriate members of households in cases when heads of households were unavailable.

One of the important goals of the research was to gather certain data about each household member, such as their age, marital status, education and working status. This is why the respondents had to be members of households who are very familiar about other household members regarding these questions, as well as being well informed about the household as a whole.
This report describes the methodology used in this survey research.

## 2 Sample design

Population for the Survey conducted for NHDR in 2012 was made of all households and individuals, who live in rural areas on the territory of the Bosnia and Herzegovina. Persons being abroad more than one year and over were excluded as
well as individuals in collective institutions and diplomatic personnel of foreign diplomatic and consular representations.
Sampling frame for the sample was the list of all individual addresses by settlements and municipalities in B\&H prepared and maintained by the The Agency for Identification Documents, Registers and Data Exchange of Bosnia and Herzegovina (IDDEEA).
In Bosnia and Herzegovina there does exist the problem of a lack of accurate and reliable data about population parameters as the last census was conducted in 1991. At Prism Research we use estimates of the number of citizens in B\&H that reside in municipalities and estimates about population structure by age and gender made by Agency of Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The sampling frame for the selection of first-stage unit was the list of all villages or rural settlements by each municipality.
The sampling frame for second-stage unit selection was the list of all addresses of individuals in the selected enumeration areas.
Stratification of enumeration areas was based on following variables: territory of B\&H, divided into two entities, three ethnic majority areas, further divided into 18 geographic regions, as it is presented on image 1 :

## Image 1: Stratification of sample by entity, ethnic-majority area, and region



An initial sample size was proportionally divided into three units:

- Federation B\&H
- Republika Srpska
- Distrikt Brcko

The sample for the Federation B\&H was further divided proportionally into regions of the Federation B\&H with Croats and Bosniaks as numeric majority ethnic groups. The Republika Srpska is treated as region with Serbs as numeric majority. In this way representativeness is achieved for rural areas in B\&H, rural areas within the entities, and ethnic-majority areas.
For each of three ethnic majority areas, the number of regional units was allocated.

- For Croat majority areas in Federation B\&H: The sample is divided into 5 regional units with Croats as majority in Federation B\&H: Posavina County, Central Bosnia County, Herzegovina - Neretva County; Western Herzegovina County; County number 10.
- For Bosniak majority areas in Federation B\&H: The sample is divided into 5 regional units with Bosniaks as majority in Federation B\&H: Una - Sana County, Tuzla County; Zenica - Doboj and Central Bosnia County, Herzegovina - Neretva County; Sarajevo - Gorazde County.
- For Republika Srpska as Serb majority areas: The sample is divided into five regional units North-West - Banjaluka; North - Doboj; North-East - Bijeljina; East - Pale and South-East - Trebinje.
- District Brčko was treated as separate region.

Each regional unit received the proportional number of blocks according to the population size of its rural areas. Municipalitie within each region are categorized by
size into four groups: large size municipalities, medium and small size municipalities and regional centers. Within each region, for each of four categories of municipalities at two are randomly selected. The total number of municipalities for the selection of rural areas is 60 . This provides adequate coverage of B\&H and its parts.
All rural areas within selected municipalities and regions received their proportion of blocks for each municipality. Random allocation of sampling blocks blocks was done proportionally to the number of individual addresses listed within each rural settlement.
Sample size was 3000 households.
Households were selected randomly in each selected enumeration area. The Random Walk technique was used for selecting households.
Interviewers were given addresses of a starting points for each starting point. Regarding that the research has been conducted only in rural areas, starting points were usually specific households or landmark buildings such as the neighborhood council buildings, post offices, or local schools. Different size settlements required different directions for finding of starting point. In some cases, the regional coordinator determined the starting point after having visited the settlement.
The interviewer was directed to face the starting point. He or she then chose the first street (house) to their right. Starting at this street (house), the interviewer proceeded in that direction and chose the second house as the first household for interviewing. If the second house is an apartment building (or has multiple dwelling units), the interviewer chose the second dwelling unit in that building to start the interviewing.
After the interview, the interviewer passed the next apartment or house and chose the second dwelling unit for the second interview. The interviewer proceeded in this pattern until the end of the street. At the end of the street, the interviewer moved to the next street on their right and continued the process until completing the quota 5 interviews for that village. In regards to the number of interviews conducted in each village, Sarajevo was somewhat specific, since the majority of residents of Sarajevo live in urban areas. Thus, and taking into account a lack of sampling points for rural areas, in some cases more than 5 interviews per sampling point were conducted in Sarajevo.
Each multi-dwelling unit was treated as one address. In one entrance the survey was conducted on only one floor, and in only one apartment. Interviewers were instructed that in each entrance, they are to interview on the first floor in one building, middle floor in second, and top floor in third multi-storey building encountered.
At the door, upon first contact, the interviewer inquired about the number of families or households residing in one apartment or house, and the number of members of each household. Interviewers then carried out selection of the household to be included by selecting the household with fewer members, and at the next encounter choosing the household with more members.

At the door, the interviewer asked to speak to the household member who is the head of the household. If that person was not at home, the interviewer arranged to revisit, or replaced this family member with the other one, who had to be very familiar with other household members characteristics, as well as the general characteristics of the household as a whole. Interviewers are directed to go on to the next unit if they cannot get the appropriate respondent after two attempts (the one who knows enough details about the household). This method ensures that the respondent is a person in the household who has the most information about the household as a whole.
Prism Research interviewers are obliged to strictly adhere to the selection of addresses or household members. If the household member who is appropriate as a respondent is not available, they are allowed only to randomly select another household and repeat the procedure of the selection of household member.

## 3 Method of interviewing

The face-to-face interview method was utilized. According to specific guidelines, interviewers were instructed to go to randomly selected household addresses at which to conduct interviews with head of household and all household members, older than 15 years.
In order to significantly improve the quality of data collected by interviewers, Prism Research used face to face CAPI, Computer Aided Personal interviewing method instead of traditional PAPI, Paper And Pencil Interviewing.
Interviewers are using PDA devices to read questions, answers and record responses. The flow of the questionnaire is controlled by specially designed software - Survey System.
Having in mind that questionnaire flow is controlled by software, logical control and consistency control of responses is done automatically, and the possibility of making mistakes is much lower in comparison to PAPI method.

## 4 Interviewers and supervisors: selection and training

Fieldwork team for this survey consisted of 13 regional coordinators and 55 interviewers. Their selection was performed on the basis of ability, previous experience, age, gender and regional origin.
Each of the regional coordinators held a training session with interviewers from their area. This training consisted of interviewing procedures, analyses by questions and role playing exercises. Each interviewer, prior to starting the fieldwork, had to perform at least one interview in the presence of coordinator or alone. The quality control of field work was performed in two ways.
After the fieldwork was completed, Prism Research supervisors used the contact information to check whether the interviewers used appropriate techniques in selecting respondents, as well as to evaluate the approach and behavior of interviewers during interviewing process. Since the quality control was performed
via telephone, supervisors contacted the respondents and using a specially designed set of questions established whether the questionnaire was properly completed. Also, during fieldwork supervisors checked each individual completed questionnaires looking for mistakes or missing data, in order to minimize the likelihood that incorrectly completed questionnaires or systematic errors of interviewers would go unnoticed. However, due to CAPI method being used for the data collection, mistakes and missing data are not very likely to occur.

## Selection and training of interviewers and supervisors

Qualifications for hire: One of the main criteria for engaging a person into this project was that they at least had high education and were good at communicating. For this project, Prism Research has hired a great deal of those interviewers who had previous experience working on other Prism Research projects. Coordinators, interviewers and controllers reside in various parts of Bosnia and Herzegovina. It was important to have interviewers who are relatively local to the various regions because they have the best knowledge of the situation in the area, as well as language spoken in it. Briefly stated, selection was made on the basis of aptitude, previous experience, age, gender, and regional origin.
Training given: Each interviewer has passed the training with his/her regional coordinator. The training consisted of two major parts: instructions QbyQ and sampling methodology. Each interviewer also participated in role play, where one of the interviewers is playing the respondent while the other is playing the interviewer, and vice versa. The regional coordinators who held these trainings tended to pass all the information gained on the general training conducted in Sarajevo. Interviewers also got written instructions about the project.
Interviewer training: Prism Research has organized the general project training session in Sarajevo, for all the regional coordinators. The training was conducted by the Research director. Research director focused on methodological issues related to sampling procedure and conducted the training on questionnaire. A total of 13 regional coordinators have been present at this training. The training took about 3 h . After this general training for the regional coordinators, each coordinator has, in their own place of residence, conducted the same training for his/her network of interviewers across Bosnia and Herzegovina. This is the standard procedure that Prism Research applies in case of any other research project.

## 5 Organization of fieldwork

Interviewing: The interviewing process started right after the interviewers have passed the training with their coordinators. A total of 55 interviewers all over Bosnia and Herzegovina took part in this project, as the fieldforce. A total of 13 coordinators were responsible to coordinate the network of fieldforce.
Quality control: Prism Research applies its own system of control of conducted questionnaires. Firstly, since the CAPI method is being in use, there are various possibilities for Prism Research to control the flow of the interview. CAPI enables designing questionnaires which would not let the important questions (such as age
of respondents and family members) to be skipped. Secondly, Prism Research is able to log the variables such as time of the beginning of the interview, time of the completion of the interview, as well as the duration of the interview, and compare these variables with norms. Thirdly, Prism Research is able to look at the data right after the completion of the interview, and make any necessary corrections. Furthermore, interviewers are obliged to ask each respondent to provide their phone number. Supervisors (controllers) in Prism Research use these numbers and control usually $20 \%$ of questionnaires of each interviewer by telephone. The interviewers do not know which questions the interviewer would ask during the control, or which questionnaires are going to be controlled.
In this manner, control of approximately $20 \%$ of addresses where interviews were conducted is controlled. During the fieldwork, each interviewer had to conduct at least one interview with the attendance of a supervisor in charge to control interviewer's fieldwork. This means that every interviewer was controlled by his supervisor during at least one interview.
During conducted controls, two of the interviewers were identified to have performed poorly, and their questionnaires were repeated.

## 6 Data checking, entry and editing

Data entry/processing: One of many advantages of conduction surveys via PDA is that it saves times because the data collection and data entry are being conducted at the same time, and it enables not having to do much of data cleaning. The entire process of data cleaning, processing, and analysis was performed in Prism Research offices in Sarajevo. The data was analyzed using PASW (Predictive Analytics Software). This software was also used to make the table presentations of data.
For data entry, specially designed software The Survey System has been used. The data are first entered into Survey System and then transfered into an PASW data file.
The data file cleaning process has been conducted by the project manager in order to deliver a clean data file to the Client.
Weighting Procedures. Weighting procedures were not used in this research.
Shown below is a sampling plan for NHDR 2012 survey.

The interviewers had to wear and visually display an identification card at all times during the field work.

The respondents often showed discomfort with the survey topics, as many personal questions have been asked. Many of them tried to avoid answering certain questions. Many respondents seem to be concerned with potential consequences that the survey might have for them and their family (such as paying high taxes for the land or outputs).
Repeated assurances that their responses are confidential did little in most cases, since the people are generally distrustful in this regard.

Each interview lasted on an average approximately 33 minutes. Accurate values of the arithmetic mean, median and mode of the length of interviews are shown in the table below.

During the interview the respondents were evaluated as cooperative in $95.9 \%$ of cases. . As for the cooperation during the interview observed by respondent's gender (Table 4), no significant difference between genders has been observed.

## 7 Description of difficulties

At the time when the Survey organization started, potential problems were short deadlines for the completion of all the necessary phases of the project implementation.
The personal nature of the Survey questions and the fact that the answers provided by the respondents revealed confidential information about their households, their families, as well as their possessions and personal attitudes, made it hard for the interviewers to convince the respondents that their households were randomly selected in the sample, that the survey was anonymous and collected data confidential. Thus, the respondents were rather reluctant to answer some questions, particularly these concerning the household income and possessions.
Majority of interviewers reported that they encountered significant difficulties when completing the questionnaires. In particular, this related to completing sections regarding the sources of income, the sections were respondents were expected to assess the surface of the land or to state the number of animals they have, as well as to remember or state the exact birth dates of their family members.

Given that the survey addresses many private question about the households, it is possible that the respondents are distrustful or concerned that what they say may be used against them in some way, such as for paying various taxes etc.
When interviewing the respondents, there were problems related to the length of the questionnaire.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina there is an existing problem of a lack of accurate and reliable data about population parameters as the last population census was conducted in 1991.
