Overall objective of ReLOaD2 is to strengthen participatory democracies and the European Union (EU) integration process in the Western Balkans by empowering civil society and youth to actively take part in decision making and by stimulating an enabling legal and financial environment for civil society organizations (CSO).

ReLOaD2 collaborates with 63 local governments across the Western Balkans and will implement 300 CSO projects and provide benefits for 35,000 beneficiaries

29% (or **135**) of **469** local governments in the Western Balkans expressed their interest to participate in ReLOaD2. ReLOaD2 partnered up with **63** local governments.

Combined with partner local governments from ReLOaD1, there are 95 local governments engaged with ReLOaD programme OR 19% of all local governments from the Western Balkan region.
