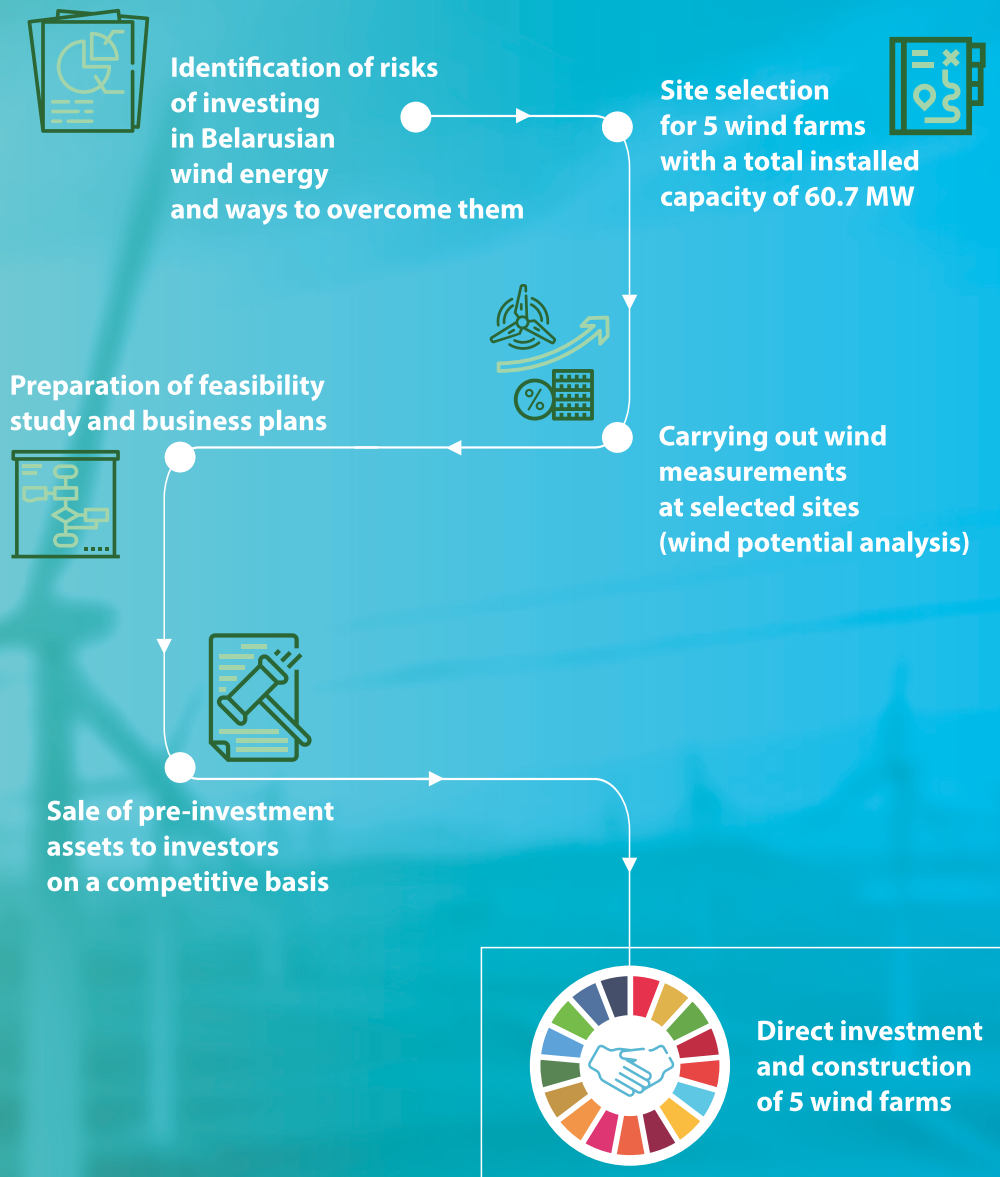




Project “Removing Barriers to Wind Power Development in Belarus”

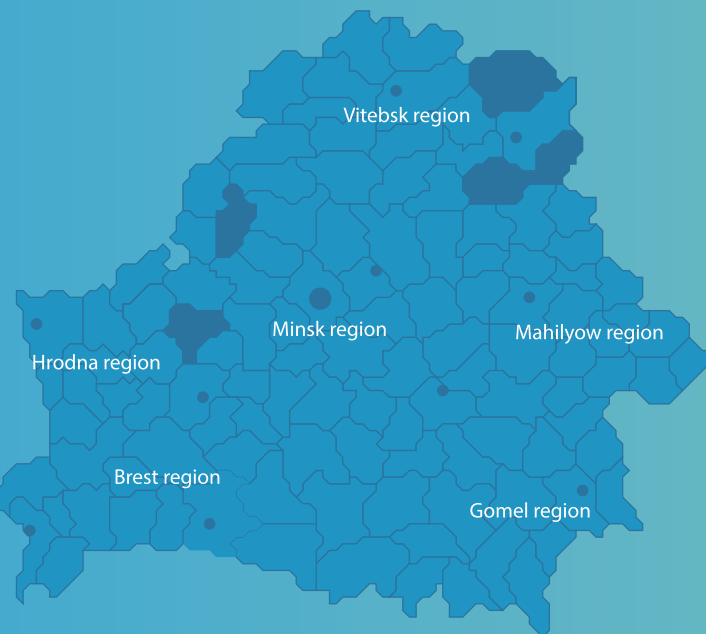




Project implementation geography:

5 districts of the Republic of Belarus

- Veleshkovichi village, Liozno district, Vitebsk region — 25 MW (7 wind turbines);
- Zagoryane village, Gorodok district; Vitebsk region — 9.9 MW (3 wind turbines);
- Veyno village, Senno district, Vitebsk region — 9.9 MW (3 wind turbines);
- Starye Boruny village, Smorgon district, Grodno region — 6 MW (3 wind turbines);
- Yanovichy village, Novogrudok district; Grodno region — 9.9 MW (3 wind turbines).
