### **The Challenges:**

of Dominica.



Sustained, heavy rainfalls in 2017 resulted in one of the worst floods in Nepal and Bangladesh. More than 8 million people were affected and many families lost their homes, belongings and livelihoods. In Pakistan, the Federally Administered Tribal Areas, located along the porous Pak-Afghan border, have also been affected by militancy and military operations for over a decade. And the influx of Rohingya refugees from Myanmar also posed many challenges in Bangladesh.



In 2017, two back-to-back category 5 hurricanes, Irma and Maria, hit the Caribbean countries, destroying homes, roads, utilities and peoples' livelihoods. In Dominica and Antigua and Barbuda, about 65% of the structures have been severely damaged, and more than 20,000 families on both islands (Dominica and Barbuda) were in need of recovery assistance. And the first step is to ensure residents return to their home islands, which required rehabilitation of the physical structures including homes, schools, and public and community structures.
