





KNOWLEDGE EXPERTISE FOCUS BUILD RESULTS

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has a wealth of knowledge and expertise, working in 177 countries worldwide to eradicate extreme poverty, strengthen good governance and prevent and respond to crises.

Last year saw several major developments; Achim Steiner was appointed UNDP's new Administrator for a four-year term, and UNDP adopted a new strategic plan which encompasses six signature solutions and aims at demonstrating tangible progress towards the achievement of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In light of the new strategic plan, UNDP Egypt in 2017 developed a new Country Programme Document for 2018 to 2022. The document draws on the 2030 Agenda and on the Sustainable Development Strategy: Egypt Vision 2030, as well as the United Nations Partnership for Development Framework (UNPDF), and focuses on three pillars: growth and innovation, environment and climate resilience, and gender equality.

As well as developing a new plan for the way forward, UNDP has continued to support the Government of Egypt in implementing key programmes and introducing new strategies to support the achievement of the SDGs.

In this context, UNDP in 2017 assisted the National Council for Women in launching Egypt's National Strategy for Women's Empowerment 2030. UNDP has also brought impact investment, or investments made to generate a measurable social and environmental impact alongside a financial return, to Egypt through the partnership with the Ministry of Investment and International Cooperation. It has fostered fruitful discussions on the role of the private sector in implementing the SDGs, thanks to the close cooperation of the American Chamber of Commerce in Egypt. UNDP has also recognized private companies for their energy-saving measures, including switching to energy-efficient LED technology, again in cooperation with the American Chamber of Commerce. In another major achievement, Egypt's first climate change adaptation project was approved in 2017 with the support of UNDP, and the Ministry of Water Resources and Irrigation. The project aims to combat shoreline erosion on the country's northern coastline, reducing the potential negative impacts of climate change.

This report presents these achievements, and many others, while giving an overview of UNDP's key milestones in 2017 and showing how UNDP provides continuous support to the Government of Egypt as it seeks to improve the livelihoods of Egyptians.



Committed to development, UNDP supported the government promptly and efficiently to address Egypt's national priorities as outlined in the Sustainable Development Strategy: Egypt Vision 2030 and in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

With the support of our partners and donors, we were able to disburse an amount of \$42.84m through 51 projects implemented all over Egypt, that benefited the Government of Egypt and its people in areas of improving livelihoods particularly for women and youth through job creation, environment protection and climate change adaptation, and the use of innovation for development.

UNDP continued to support the Social Fund for Development while it transitioned to the new Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) Development Agency. The Agency extended financial services to over







UNDP supported the General Organization for physical Planning (GOPP) in preparing the Land Development Map for Eaupt which will be the mechanism to support the issuance of the Planning Law, as an executive tool required to implement the strategic plans' outputs at the national, regional and governorate levels, in line with the State Plan for Economic and Social Development.



UNDP mobilized resources and expertise to support the Ministry of Water and Irrigation test soft engineering solutions covering 3.5 km of the North Coast, to counter shoreline erosion, now scaling up to additional 69 km under the Green Climate Fund. This work is expected to reduce the significant economic losses from shoreline erosion impacting the lives of

25% of Egyptians.





UNDP provided technical expertise for the restoration of 10 protected areas: the Petrified Forests, Wadi Degla, Wadi Rayan, Qatrani, Ras Mohamed, Naba, Abu Gallum, Saint Catherine, Wadi Gemal and Siwa, out of 30 declared in Egypt, with the generous support of the Italian Cooperation, with revenues reaching



INNOVATE FOR SOMALIA:

UNDP Egypt supports UNDP Somalia in mainstreaming and adopting innovation for development. Through the UNDP Egypt Innovation Lab, we supported UNDP Somalia in the design thinking process as a tool for problem-solving. Further support was provided post innovation camp.

LAUNCH OF THE REGIONAL UN TECHNOLOGY INNOVATION LAB:

UNDP helped establish and capitalize on the findings emerging from the Innovation labs. The Labs acts as a source for the exchange of knowledge and experience, designing development projects, with the purpose of exploring solutions through technology and innovation. The Labs also serve as links with various parts of the UN system on innovation issues.

THE EGYPTIAN DJIBOUTIAN CAPACITY ACCELERATION PROGRAM (EDCA):

UNDP Egypt led the launch of two training rounds in Cairo for a total of 24 Djiboutian students in Cairo. Training rounds were for Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) and Applications Development (respectively). Plans for creating a sustainable capacity development activity within the Djiboutian system is in place. This involves the establishment of an Egyptian-Djiboutian Capacity Development Center of Excellence (under construction).

EXPANSION OF THE INSTITUTE FOR NILE STATES STRATEGIC STUDIES & RESEARCHES (INSSR):

UNDP helped the information infrastructure team to design a portal for INSSR of Nile Basin Countries, a unique institute that is concerned with research on issues related to the Nile Basin Countries. The upgrade of their information system will enable them to capitalize and disseminate their research, enhance joint research and cooperation.
