

Our 2016 Highlights



By the end of 2016,

we were **supporting 11 countries to address sustainability issues** across seven highly-traded commodities.

We supported stakeholders to draft a National Action Plan for **Sustainable Palm Oil**

through the Sustainable Palm Oil Platform, FOXBI, in Indonesia.



We started work with the Government of Papua New Guinea to design a palm oil **Platform to help address sustainability issues** in this rapidly growing sector.



We supported soy and beef stakeholders in Paraguay to make a significant advance towards agreeing a minimum set of **legal production standards** with a national collection of **good agricultural practices**. This was done alongside a revision and modification of the environmental legal framework.

Our partnership with Mondelez in Ghana completed three successful years in 2016, **benefiting 9,600 farmers** and **helping to plant 800,000 shade trees** on cocoa farms. The project has been extended to 2020.



We supported Government and supply chain stakeholders in Paraguay to develop **Action Plans for sustainable soy and beef production** in the Alto Paraná region.



Our community of practice now involves UNDP staff, government officials and private sector partners from

14 different countries with **11** training events held this year.

We supported Costa Rica to **launch a national platform on sustainable fisheries**.




Our experts worked at the request of the Ivory Coast Government to incorporate sustainable commodity strategies into the national REDD+ strategy, which is aimed at **achieving zero-deforestation from agriculture**.

Our experts supported Costa Rica to finalise a **national monitoring system** that will identify farmers who conserve forest and those who are deforesting.



In Ecuador, we advised on the design of a major new programme for **reducing amazonian deforestation** from cocoa, coffee, palm oil and beef production.



With our partners CI, WWF, IFC, and UNEP, we completed the design of the new GEF-funded **US\$45 million global programme** aimed at Taking Deforestation out of Commodity Supply Chains.

In Peru we worked with the Government and industry to **design a national coffee platform**, which is set to start work in 2017.
