





PRODUCTIVITY

Average 1.9 -2.5 tonnes / hectare of CPO (Crude Palm Oil), far from the sector's production potential of 5 tons/ hectare

(IN)EFFICIENCY

Just 1/3 of Indonesia's oil palm plantations are managed efficiently to maximise yield

SHARE OF PRODUCTION

2.5 million smallholders farm up to 42% (4.4 million hectares) of plantations







SMALLHOLDERS ARE KEY TO SUSTAINABLE PALM OIL PRODUCTION IN INDONESIA






Replanting with high yielding seedlings
