

# Indonesia Palm Oil:

## The Indonesian Palm Oil Platform and the National Action Plan

### Launched in

**2014,** FoKSBI is the multi-stakeholder Indonesia sustainable palm oil platform, led by the government and facilitated by UNDP's Sustainable Palm Oil initiative (SPOI). It provides a neutral space for stakeholders to come together and address key challenges in the development of sustainable palm oil in Indonesia. FoKSBI's main task is to develop the National Action Plan (NAP) for Sustainable Palm Oil, and to monitor its implementation.

### From 2015 -

**2016,** four technical working groups explored key barriers to sustainability as identified by stakeholders participating in the Platform. Based on Root Cause Analysis, they identified the root causes that need to be addressed, rather than just the symptoms that appear on the surface. These areas were:

FoKSBI's Steering Committee is led by The Deputy for Food and Agriculture, Coordinating Ministry of Economic Affairs, with Director General of Estate Crops, Ministry of Agriculture as the co-chair.

## The National Action Plan



Based on their findings, the working groups then drafted the National Action Plan and in 2017, the Platform facilitated widespread consultations with government, civil society, the private sector both nationally and internationally on the draft National Action Plan.

### NAP Components:



Better coordination of smallholders through first-ever mapping exercise; also training, and better access to seeds, finance as well as other services.



More effective sector governance, including improved law enforcement, faster resolution of land conflicts, and tighter oversight of licensing.



Improved environmental management and monitoring through biodiversity conservation, reduction of greenhouse gases, more productive use of land already under cultivation, protection of environmental services.



Accelerated smallholder certification under the Indonesian Palm Oil standard (ISPO). Also, facilitate greater market acceptance of ISPO, while also strengthening the institution and governance.

# Regional Platforms — and Action Plans

In addition to the national FoKSBI Platform, to tailor solutions to the specific challenges faced by different palm oil producing areas across Indonesia, six platforms are now operating at different administrative levels in the country.



### 3 Provincial Platforms:

- In Riau, North Sumatra and West Kalimantan.

### 3 District Platforms:

- In Sintang, South Tapanuli and Pelalawan.

These provincial and district platforms are responsible for developing their own action plans, which are derived from the NAP.

## Getting Behind Indonesia's National Action Plan

Under the coordination of the government, the private sector and donors can use Indonesia's National Action Plan and those being developed at the regional and district levels as a reference for their contribution and commitment towards sustainable palm oil in the country.
